## SEAFOOD AU GRATIN

| $1 / 2$ lb. shrimp, cleaned | 2 tbsp. bread crumbs |
| :--- | :--- |
| $1 / 2$ lb. bay scallops | 1 small chopped onion |
| 2 tbsp. margarine | $1-1 / 2$ cup low fat milk |
| 1 can cream of mushroom soup $1 / 4$ tsp. white pepper |  |
| 1 cup thawed frozen peas | 1 tbsp. lemon juice |
| $1-1 / 2$ cup minute rice |  |
| Saute shrimp, scallops and onion in 1 tablespoon of hot |  |
| margarine in a large skillet until shrimp are pink and |  |
| scallops are opaque. Stir in soup, milk, peas, lemon juice and |  |
| pepper. Bring to aboil. Stir in rice; cover. Remove from heat |  |
| and let stand for 5 minutes. |  |
| In the meantime, combine bread crumbs and |  |
| remaining margarine in small microwaveable bowl. |  |
| Microwave on HIGH, uncovered, 1 to $1-1 / 2$ minutes, stirring |  |
| halfway through cooking time, until crumbs are golden |  |

That old standby, the peasant blouse, is easy to fit and make, but if you are wanting something different and are having trouble with fitting, here are three ideas that may help:

1. Make sure the pattern is the right size. Take your chest or high bust measurement and compare it to your bust measurement. If the difference is $2^{\prime \prime}$ or more, substitute the high bust number on the measurement chart when selecting size. You may have to enlarge the bust line area (easy to do) but you'll get a better neck and shoulder fit.
2. Most womens' shoulders are dipped in front and rounded in the back and sometimes tilted forward. Patterns don't take this into account and you end up with a neckline that gapes and rides up at the shoulder. Try adding $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ to $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ to the BACK shoulder seam and take off the same amount from the FRONT shoulder seam. Adjust the facings also. Just that small adjustment lets the blouse rest squarely on the shoulders.
3. For a closely fitted bodice with set-in sleeves-as many square dance dresses are-the back width must be adequate or you will be uncomfortable and the back sleeve seams will be ripping out. To give yourself more room, add $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ to the bodice back pattern piece from just below the shoulder seam to the notches. Add an equal amount to the back side seam at the underarm.

There are many good sewing books on the market that will help with fitting problems and learning to fit properly makes all the difference in the comfort and looks of your finished garment.

At the joint CCR/Federation meeting in November, the callers were asked about badges worn by callers. There are four types of badges worn by callers:

1. Callerlab,
2. American Callers Association,
3. CCR (Callers' Cooperative of Rochester),
4. Club badge.

Most callers belong to a national organization, i.e. Callerlab or American Callers Assoc. The national organization provides uniformity in the dance program throughout the world. It also provides ASCAP/BMI licensing-paid for by the caller-which is a burden that the callers have removed from individual clubs. The national organization has negotiated a national contract at a lower cost. Had that not happened, each dance would have cost the club approximately $\$ 22.00$. Another benefit is a group insurance program for callers. The Callerlab badge is white with red lettering; the American Callers Assoc. badge is red with silver lettering; the CCR badge is red and blue and the club badge is a badge provided by the club that the caller is calling for.

The Callers Co-op of Rochester would like to thank the dancers that attended the Flood Relief Dance in January. In excess of $\$ 150.00$ was donated to the Salvation Army for the relief of flood victims in the midwest. We would also like to thank the dancers who attended the Sweetheart Dance on February 6.

## BANNER STEALING RULES

Clubs wishing to participate in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and must have at least one miniature Traveling Banner that will be used for stealing.


In order to steal a member club's banner, the Stealing (visiting) Club must have at least four couples (one square) who have paid the Visitor's fee at the host club. A representative of the Stealing Club must then make it known to the president of the Host Club that they are attending the dance for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's Banner.

In the event that more than one club is attending for the purpose of stealing the Host Club's only available banner, it will be the duty of the President of the Host Club to determine some fair way to choose which of the Stealing Clubs will be awarded the banner.

Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve said banner by sending no less than four couples to the Stealing Club's dance and then they can take their banner back home. If the retrieving club also wishes to steal the banner of their host, they must then have a second four couples in order to be eligible. Couples must pay the regular guest fee.

At no time can a member club allow another club to take a banner belonging to a third club. Also, when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the receiving club's duty to safeguard the banner they have stolen at all times. If the banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three months excluding June, July and August) the stealing club will be allowed to have at least four couples (max. eight couples not necessarily the stealing couples) return the banner as special FREE guests of the owning club. The president of the owning club must be given at least one week prior notice. (Impending plans to retrieve banner made known at that time will have priority over plans to return banner.)

Banner stealing shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so designate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than the regular club caller shall be a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated.
