LEADERSHIP AWARD BACKGROUND

The Leadership Award was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma and Daphne. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED **LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS** in square, round, or contra dancing. Leadership, service, and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include, but are not limited to, years of dancing or calling, membership, committee service, or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra Club, Rochester Area Federation, Promenader, Dance-O-Rama, NYS Association or National Associations, promoting the activity through calling or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the square dance activity. Finally, consideration is given to the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the square dance community.

An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria.

Anyone in the square dance community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award. The Rochester area is blessed with many fine leaders and it would be helpful to those on the Selection Committee to receive input from the square dance community. If you know of someone you feel should be considered, please send a note identifying the individual or couple and their qualifications. Send the information to Walt & Sally Baechle, 173 Arcadia Parkway, Rochester, NY 14612. The Baechles will be serving on the Selection Committee for three years, and would be happy to present candidates and their qualifications to the committee for consideration.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Club officers: Try to pay more attention to this calendar when planning your special dance and don't just list any guest caller as a special event. With a little planning, your event will be special and your attendance will show it.

SUMMER DANCING called by Gary Bubel Tues June 7 - Aug 9

E Henrietta Fire Dept

One of the fun things to do when you make your own dance outfits is to make a "carry-along" purse to match a shirt or outfit. To do this, cut four 13-1/2" diameter circles—two from exterior fabric and two from lining fabric. Assume your circles are a clock face and cut straight across the circle from 10 o'clock so you will have pieces somewhat larger than a semi-circle.

On all four pieces, measure in 2" from both corners, along the straight edge and mark. Gather between the marks so the straight edge is 8" long. Turn each gathered edge under 1/4" and press and baste down. Baste each exterior fabric piece to a lining piece, wrong sides together along the circular edge—leaving the gathered and pressed edge open.

Insert the tape of a 7" zipper between the gathered and pressed edges of the lining and exterior fabric and stitch. You will have 1/2" at each end of the zipper. Make a strap using a strip of exterior fabric 2" wide and 45" long. Fold each long edge into the middle of 2" wide strip and press. Fold the strip again, in half, lengthwise, press and stitch. That way the raw edges will be enclosed. Or you can use a purchased cord or strap. Pin the strap ends into the 1/2" opening at the ends of the zipper. Open the zipper.

Turn the layers of fabric so the right sides are together and stitch, using a 1/4" seam, from one end of the zipper, around to the other end, being careful to catch only the ends of the strap in the seam. Double stitch this for security. Turn right side out, through the zipper and enjoy!

The weather has finally taken a turn for the better. This seems like the proper time to think about all those good B-B-Q recipes for the summer cookouts. Not many folks think about grilling lamb, but this recipe is easy, simple and so delicious.



BUTTERFLIED LEG OF LAMB

BUTTERFULES OF	LAND
1 6 lb. butterflied leg of lamb	1 tbsp butter
2 or more cloves sliced garlic	1 tbsp lemon juice
1/2 cup cider vinegar	1/2 cup mint jelly
1/4 cup brown sugar	1/4 cup sugar
1 tsp grated lemon rind	1-1/2 tsp salt
1/2 tsp dry mustard	Pepper to taste

Wash lamb and pat dry; sprinkle with salt & pepper to taste. Poke with sharp knife all over and insert garlic slices in slits. In a saucepan, combine vinegar, sugars, butter, lemon juice & rind. Bring to a boil. Add mustard & salt. Pour over lamb and marinate 3 to 4 hours, or overnight, covered and refrigerate. Before grilling, drain and reserve marinade. Grill over low coals, in closed grill. (I use a flat basket on a rotisserie.) Grill for approximately 1 hour or three martinis, whichever comes first. Turn lamb often and brush with reserved marinade. If using the rotisserie, omit turning step. Don't let coals flare up. Let lamb stand 10 minutes before carving in slices. Enjoy!
