

The summer is about over. I hope you all had a good one. It's September and if the kids are not back in school they will be soon and once more sanity will return to most households. here is an

easy recipe which will pique, not only the curiosity of those to whom you serve it, but the senses of smell and taste as well.

#### CHICKEN GARLIC

1 3/4 lb. chicken, cut up -- 1 lg. onion -- 4-6 carrots --40 cloves garlic (minimum) -- 4 stalks celery -- 1 1/2 cps dry white wine -- 1 loaf French bread -- butter for browning

1. In a large casserole with a tight fitting lid, put 2 or 3 tablespoon of olive oil. Clean and dry cut up chicken pieces and roll in the oil to coat lightly.

2. Cut the carrots, celery, and onion into matchstick pieces. Spread these around and over the chicken.

Peel at least 40 cloves of garlic and add them, whole, to the casserole. Add the wine (You may choose vermouth, white table wine, chardonnay, chenin blanc or any other good dry white wine to your taste). Cover tightly with aluminum foil and then put on the casserole lid. Cook in a 325F oven for 1 1/2 to 2 hours depending on the size of your chicken.
Melt butter in a large frying pan and brown 1/2 inch thick slices of French bread on both sides.

5. Serve in soup plates with the toasted bread on the side to spread with the Garlic. Enjoy!




Well, here it is almost the end of summer. I sure hope all of you had as good a summer as Kay and I. We were talking about how enthusiastic our new class has been about square dancing.

Don't forget our Open House dances on September 14 & 21! Members, please bring your friends and neighbors and give them a taste of fun they can experience in square dancing.


