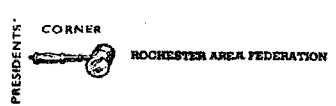

Why? Because we need them to keep the activity going and to bring in new enthusiasm and ideas. The following is a copy of "NEW DANCERS' BILL OF RIGHTS" developed by Callerlab in 1988 and released August of 1994. Please read the six points and think how you may adapt them to our NEW DANCERS-Have a great month of dancing!!

NEW DANCERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

A new square dancer has the right:

1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
2. To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.
3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes, prior to graduation.
4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.
5. To instruction and practice using the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call. (Basic, Mainstream, Etc.)
6. To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.

As stated above, the "BILL OF RIGHTS" was approved by our entire membership. We encourage ALL callers and square dancers alike to help put in FUN and FRIENDLINESS back into Square Dancing.

Chef's Corner

Summer is over, the kids are back to school, and friends you haven't seen for the past few months are returning home from their cottages, camps, lakeside retreats, etc. Now might be a good time for getting together over a cup of coffee to chat about the events of the summer. Fish stories, memorable boat rides and things of that nature are enhanced by a good "Kaffe Klatsch". Here is a positively sinful dessert to go along with the coffee.

CHOCOLATE RUM ANGEL

- 1 1/2 cups milk --- 2 eggs, beaten --- 1/2 cup sugar ---
- 1/4 tsp salt --- 1 env unflav. gelatin
- 1/3 cup cold water
- 3/4 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- 2 tbs rum or rum flavoring
- 1 1/2 cups whipping cream
- 1 13 or 16 oz. angel food cake
- 1/2 cup sliced almonds

Blend first 4 ingredients in top of double boiler and cook over simmering water, stirring until mixture is of custard consistency and coats a spoon. Soften gelatin in cold water and add to hot custard, stirring to dissolve. Remove 1 cup of custard and add to chocolate chips. Stir until chocolate is melted, set aside. When remaining custard is cool, add rum and chill until mixture just begins to thicken. Whip cream and fold into chilled custard. Tear cake into pieces and fold into custard. Pour mixture into 9" springform pan or a 9x13" pan. Drizzle chocolate custard over top and sprinkle with almonds. Chill to set. If using springform pan, unmold. Cut into serving pieces and garnish each with additional sweetened whipped cream and a sliced fanned strawberry. Serves 14-16. Enjoy!!

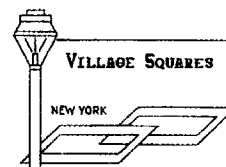

Do plan to howl with us at Halloween and see what the Village People come up with, this year.

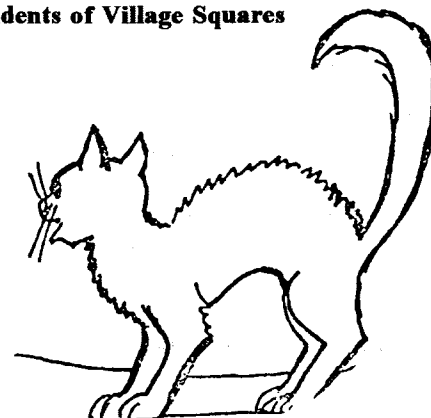

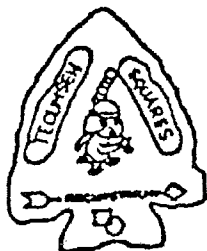

UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

Indianapolis, Indiana was chosen as the site of the future National Square Dance Convention in 1999! This was the announcement at the ceremonies on Saturday night in Portland, Oregon where the 43rd National Square Dance Convention was held, June 22nd - 25th, 1994. There were 21,770 in attendance, including dancers from all 50 states and many foreign countries.

Forty states had 50 or more dancers in Portland and 36 states, including New York, had 100 or more. Thus making it truly a "National Convention." Also 994 were from 14 foreign countries, including 293 from Canada.

Conventions start on the Wednesday before the fourth Thursday in June and lasts four days. They are awarded five years in advance. Next years National Convention will be in BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA! June 21st - 24th, 1995.

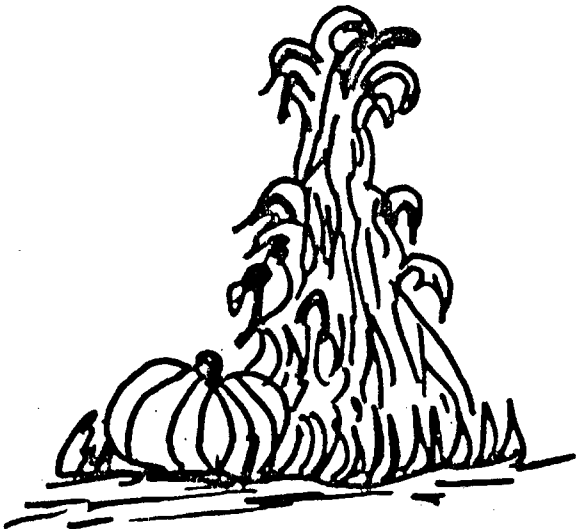
An ugly old witch -- believe it if you can --

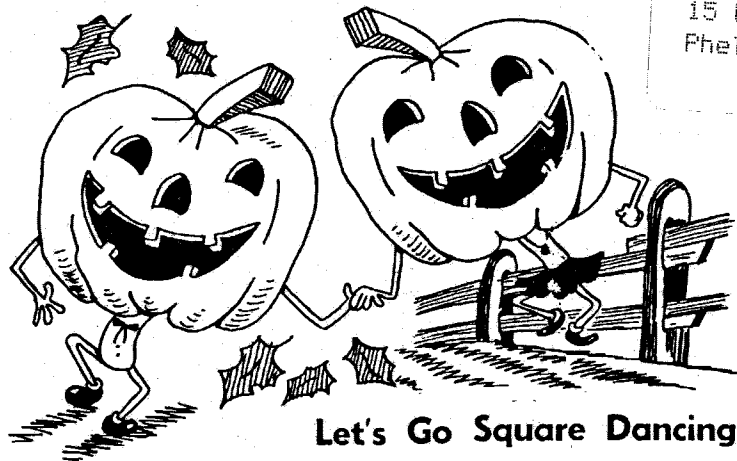
