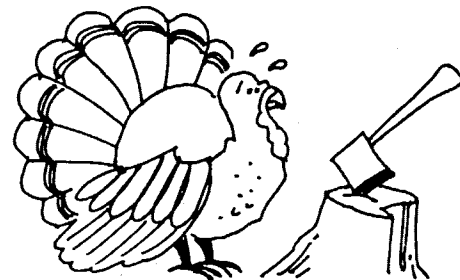

CHEF'S CORNER

I can't believe how fast this year has passed. Here it is November and there is a definite chill in the air. I have chosen a hearty stew to help ward off the chill.



GREEK BEEF STEW

1/2 stick unsalted butter--1 bay leaf--3 lbs beef chuck, cut up--1 c beef broth--6 oz tomato paste--1/4 c red wine vinegar--2 T light brown sugar--1 t minced garlic--1 c dry red wine--1 1/2 t ground cumin-- 1/2 t ground allspice--1/2 lb mushrooms--18 small white onions--3 T unsalted butter

1. Blanch onions in boiling water for 1 minute, drain & peel.
2. In a kettle, melt the 1/2 stick of butter over moderate heat, add the beef and toss to coat with the butter. Do not let it brown.
3. Add the wine, broth, tomato paste, vinegar, sugar, cumin, garlic, allspice and the bay leaf. Salt and pepper to taste. Bring the mixture to a boil. Lower the heat and simmer, covered, for 1 1/2 hours.
4. Add the onions and simmer, covered for 30 minutes more.
5. Quarter the mushrooms and saute' in the 3 T of butter over moderately high heat for 3 minutes and add to the stew. Discard the bay leaf and transfer to a heated casserole.
6. Serve with warm, crusty sourdough bread and butter.

DANCING FOR FUN AND EXERCISE

Dancing provides a challenge that will make you happy. Also, the variety of dances frees you from boredom. According to a recent survey, a half-hour of high-intensity dancing offers the same aerobic benefits as jogging for 30 minutes at 5+ MPH or playing basketball or handball for 30 minutes. College researchers have determined that people can lose more than two pounds a week if they dance vigorously for 30 minutes, three times a week for 12 weeks. Dancing works your lower body muscles, plus it is weight-bearing exercise which builds strong bones. It improves your cardiovascular fitness and increases the ability to recover from mental and physical stress. Staying fit helps you adapt to heat and cold, burns off fat, slows down aging, helps fight depression--the benefits of dancing are endless--best of all, it revs up your energy.

Callerlab suggest dancers dance at every level one year before going on to the next. American Callers Association is combining and condensing both Mainstream and PLUS to get new dancers at the club level quicker, so we don't lose so many new dancers. This is just a thought on how to retain new dancers and allow the activity to grow. We welcome your thoughts and suggestions.

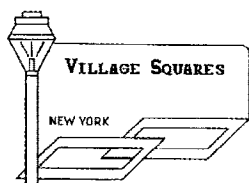
Thanksgiving time already, hard to believe. How time flies when you are having fun dancing with the Finger lakes Squares.
