## CHEF'S CORNER



December has arrived and we are plunging into the Holiday Season head first, feet first, or whatever comes first. To take some of the pressure off, here is an easy dish which, when served with mashed or oven roasted potatoes and a green vegetable, is not only attractive, but delicious as well.

## GLAZED CORNISH HENS

1 cup wild rice--6/8 cups boiling water--2 1/2 tsp salt  
1 cup raw white rice--1 med onion, chopped--2 4oz cans sliced mushroom--1 3/4 cups melted butter--1/2 cup slivered almond--8 cornish hen--1/4 tsp pepper--1/2 cup bourbon--1 cube chicken bouillon--8 tsp currant jelly or blackberry jam

Wash wild rice. Pour into boiling water w/1 tsp salt, cover. Cook 15 min, add white rice. Cook 30 min longer. Saute' onions and mushrooms 5 min in 1/2 cup butter. Stir in almonds, then the cooked and drained rice. Stir until well mixed. Stuff the cavity of hens with rice mixture and lace with string or skewers. Tie legs together and make triangle out of the wings behind the neck. Place on shallow baking sheet, breast side up. Mix remaining salt and pepper with 1/2 cup butter and pour over hens. Place in 425F oven, roast 20 min, basting 3 times with bourbon mixed with remaining butter. Reduce heat to 350F, roast 30 min more, basting every 10 min w/bourbon & butter mix. Turn breast side down, roast 15 min more. If drippings evaporate, add bouillon cube dissolved in 1 cup boiling water. Baste regularly to guarantee juiciness. Pour melted jelly over hens for the last half hour of cooking. Serves 8.

Every dancer in this activity is needed to become involved if we are to see square, round, clogging, contra, line and heritage dancing become New York's folk dance... and folks, we are behind the rest of our country.

At the present time twenty-two (22) states have permanent legislation making square dancing and its allied dance forms as the American Folk Dance (AFD) of the states.

Twenty-four (24) states have appointed legislative chairmen to promote AFD of the states. Only four states have not appointed chairmen. Our ultimate goal, of course, is to make Square Dancing and its allied dance forms the American Folk Dance of the United States.

And, with you and your help this can be done -- one step at a time.

Recently at the New York State Square and Round Dance Festival in Syracuse, New York, Sally and Walt Baechle of Rochester and Pat and Joe Schanzer of Buffalo became co-chairmen of this endeavor. They need the entire dance community of New York State to be actively involved in the quest to make our recreational activity New York's Folk Dance.

Some of the activities you may do are: sign petitions, write and send petitions as individuals, talk to relatives and friends, follow reports issued at each stage of progress, start a club drive to get dancers involved, and be positive and proud.

\* The preceding are taken from legislation by states who have passed square dancing and its allied dance forms as their state folk dance, with the exception of the final statement which came from Gov. Cuomo's 1994 legislative act proclaiming September Square Dance Month.

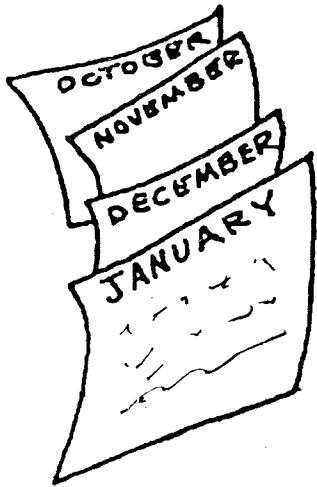
