## CHEF'S CORNER

Here is a quick and easy meal for a cold winters night.

## EGGPLANT CASSEROLE

11 lb eggplant, 2 tbsp butter, 6 sliced green onions w/tops, $11 / 2$ cups dry herb stuffing mix, 14.5 oz can stewed tomatoes, $1 / 2$ cup chicken stock, $1 / 2$ c mozzarella, 1 rib celery, chopped, salt \& pepper to taste

Peel eggplant and cut into 1" cubes. In a 2 quart casserole combine eggplant, onions, celery and butter. Cover and microwave on HIGH 8 to 10 minutes. Do not drain. Add stewed tomatoes, including the liquid, stuffing mix, stock, salt and pepper. Cover and microwave on HIGH 4 minutes. Top with cheese and microwave on HIGH 1 minute or until cheese melts. Freezable!!!

Note \#1: For variation, add 1 cubed medium zucchini and/or 1 cubed medium yellow squash.

Note \#2: To reduce total fat, either use skim milk mozzarella or substitute farmer's cheese.

UNA BISHOP SHAW: Born July 9, 1910 in St. Petersport, Guernsey Islands, England, Una came to the United States in 1928 with her parents, Tom and Anne Carter Bishop and her sister Edna. They lived in New York for three year before moving to Rochester in 1931. Una's father was a musician, and Una was a talented pianist, a fact she closely guarded.

She met George C. Shaw in Rochester, They married in 1935 and had three sons, George B., Ralph, and Bruce. Their first home was on Ballantyne Road, and in 1961 they moved to Chestnut Ridge Road in Chili. Una loved to entertain and hosted many parties throughtout the years.

She was a charter member of the Riverdale Fire Department (1941), and a member of Order of Eastern Star, Chapter 32, from 1954-1980, serving as matron in 1960. She retired from Mixing Equipment Company in 1975. Una had been active in the Rochester Square Dance Community since 1962. Along with George, they served as club officers at times, and chaired the Muscular Dystrophy Benefit Dances from 1968-1977. In recent years she did volunteer work with Reach for Recovery, and was also a member of the Clan Shaw Society.

1. Clubs wishing to take part in Banner stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation.
2. Those clubs registering with the Federation must have at least one Traveling Banner that will be used for stealing.
3. In order to steal a member club's banner, The Stealing club must have at least four couples (one square) who have paid the visitors fee at the Host club. A representative of the Stealing club must advise the president of the Host club at least 48 hrs . in advance of their intention to steal the Host's Club Banner.
4. In the event that more than one club notifies the Host club of their intention to steal the Host club's only banner, the first club which notified the Host club should be given preference.
5. Once a club's banner has been stolen, that club may retrieve their banner by sending no less than four paying couples to the stealing club's dance. The banner will then be returned to them.
6. If the retrieving club also wishes to steal the banner of their hosts, they must have at least a second square of four paying couples in order to be eligible. Therefore, in order to retrieve your banner and steal the other clubs banner, it will be necessary to have two squares attending.
7. At no time can a member club allow any other club to take a banner belonging to the third club. Also when a club steals a banner from a club, it is the receiving club's duty to safe-guard the banner thay have stolen at all times.
8. If the banner has not been retrieved by the owning club within a reasonable period of time (three months of that. clubs dancing season), the stealing club will be allowed to send no more than four couples, as guests, at no charge from the owning club, to return the banner. The President of the owning club shall be notified at least one week in advance that the stealing club plans to attend to return their banner.
9. Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular club dances only, and does not include any special dances a club might hold and so designate. In addition to those dances so designated, any dance which has a caller other than their regular club caller shall be deemed a special dance. If a club does not have a regular caller, all dances shall be regular club dances unless so designated. A last minute replacement caller shall not be considered a guest caller.
