These include the dancer's own hearing ability, the hall acoustics, the P.A. system settings (volume and tone control settings, speaker placement, etc.), the distance between the speaker and dancer, and the ambient (background) noise in the room (people talking, fans, etc.). How do you help the dancer hear your calls/cues, without also enhancing the unwanted ambient noise? The device (ALD) or hearing enhancement system. ## Well here we are into May

 already. It's hard to believe that spring is about half over. I just realized that I haven't given you any "sweets" for a long time, so here is a goodic for you.
## SCRUMPTIOUS CARAMEL BARS

1 cup flour-1/4 tsp salt - $1 / 4$ tsp baking powder - $1 / 2$ cup packed brown sugar- $3 / 4$ cup rolled oats, (not instant) - $1 / 2$ cup margarine - 24 caramel candies 2 tbs light cream-1/2 cup semisweet chocolate chips.

1. In mixing bowl combine flour, salt, soda, brown sugar and oats. Cut in margarine with pastry blender until fine particles are formed. Set aside 1 cup of this mixture.
2. Press remaining mixture into bottom only of a greased 8 inch square baking pan. Bake at 350 F for 10 minutes.
3. In top of double boiler, combine caramels and cream. Cook over boiling water until caramels are melted. Blend in 2 tbs flour.
4. Spread caramel mixture carefully over baked mixture. Sprinkle with chocolate chips, then reserved crumbs.
5. Bake at 350 F for $\mathbf{1 2 - 1 5}$ minutes until delicately browned.

Cool for a few minutes before cutting into 24 bars.
