It's September. Wow! Did that summer go fast! But we still have some warm weather left for entertaining friends before, you should excuse the expression, "Winter" sets in. Here is a delightful chicken recipe which my wife raves about.

## PICCATA CHICKEN

4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves--1/4 cup flour-$-1 / 4$ tsp salt- $1 / 4$ tsp white pepper--2 tbs oil- $1 / 2$ cup chicken broth--2 tsp Worcestershire sauce-- $1 / 4$ tsp dried marjoram leaves- 2 tbs fresh lemon juice- $1 / 4$ cup chopped fresh parsley.

Place 1 chicken breast between 2 pieces of plastic wrap. Gently pound chicken with flat side of meat mallet or rolling pin, until about $1 / 4$ inch thick; repeat with remaining chicken.

In small shallow bowl, combine flour, salt, and pepper. Coat chicken with flour mixture. Heat oil in large skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Add chicken; cook 3 to 5 minutes per side until golden brown and no longer pink.

Remove chicken from skillet; cover to keep warm. Add broth, Worcestershire sauce and marjoram to skillet; cook and stir 1 to 2 minutes; stir in lemon juice and parsley. Pour over chicken. Serve with rice and vegetable of your choice. Enjoy!
