We know this happens as our Club contracts that far in advance for our Watkins Weekend and our other Special Dances. Also, clubs are feeling a reduction of dancers and that should be a warning that we need all the dancers we can get for Special Dances and not have to share, where both clubs suffer. Callers & Cuers are not cheap and hall costs are also going up. Let's all cooperate!

AMARETTO CHICKEN BREASTS

6 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves--flour--salt & pepper-garlic powder--curry powder--1/4 cup butter--1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced thick--1/4 cup Amaretto--grated rind and juice of 1 lemon--1 1/2 cups chicken broth--1 tbsp cornstarch-cooked rice.

Cut chicken into 1" strips. Sprinkle with seasonings. Roll in flour. Heat butter in large skillet; brown pieces on all sides over medium heat. Add mushrooms, Amaretto, lemon rind & juice. Simmer 5 minutes. Mix broth and cornstarch; stir mixture into skillet. Stir over low heat until mixture bubbles & thickens. Serve over hot cooked rice. Enjoy!



For October we are joining with Victor Swing-A-Longs to bring




There will be no dance on October 27th because many of our members will be flinging at the Falls. Hope to see everyone






I have the following comment to make, so please have patience:
