

This means we'll be dancing <u>every</u> Monday afternoon. The time remains the same: 1:00 -3:00pm. Cost is \$2.50 per




person and Mike Callahan is our regular caller.

Staying fit helps you adapt to heat and cold, burns off fat, slows down aging, helps fight depression--the benefits of dancing are endless--best of all, it revs up your energy.




