HAND GUIDED QUILIING MACHINE

This is the time of the year when we are taking advantage of springtime. Too many times we are caught short for a quick meal after a day in the yard clearing out the ravages of winter. Here is a quick and tasty meal that can be prepared in no time.

## STROGANOFF ALA CHEF $Z$

1 lb . sliced mushrooms -2 lg . onions, sliced -8 tbsp vegetable oil - 5 lb . beef (round steak) - $21 / 2$ cup water $-21 / 2$ tbsp beef bouillon granules - $21 / 2$ tsp dry mustard - $11 / 4$ tsp salt - 3/8 tsp pepper - 5 tbsp flour - 3/4 cup water -2 cup sour cream - 3 pk . 12 oz . wide egg noodles.

Saute' mushrooms and onions in oil until soft. Remove from pan and set aside. Slice meat $2^{\prime \prime} \times 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, brown in small batches. Reduce heat to simmer. Return vegetables and meat to pan. Add water and seasonings. Cover and simmer about 45 minutes or until meat is tender. Combine flour and $3 / 4$ cup water, stir until smooth. Stir into meat mixture and stir until sauce thickens. Reduce temperature to low heat, just before serving, stir in sour cream. Stir until hot, do not boil. Ladle over hot cooked noodles. Serve with warm Italian or French bread.
NOTE: To have really tender meat, substitute beef chuck roast for the round steak which can tend to be tough at times.
HINT: Use butter flavored Crisco as a substitute for the vegetable oil.
