Here it is September and summer is getting ready to bid us adieu. But wait, there will still be a few more picnics and/or warm evenings to enjoy a cool and quick pasta and seafood salad.

## SHRIMP \& LOBSTER LOUIS SALAD

4 oz uncooked rainbow rotini -- $1 / 3$ cup mayonnaise or salad dressing (I use no-fat mayo) - 2 tbs-ehopped green onions - 3 tbs chili sauce -- 1 tsp lemon juice -- $1 / 4 \mathrm{lb}$ flaked cooked lobster or crabmeat (I use imitation crabmeat) -- 2 to 4 leaves of leaf lettuce.

1) Cook rotini to desired doneness as directed on package.
2) Meanwhile, in medium bowl, combine mayonnaise, onions, chili sauce and lemon juice; mix well.
3) Drain rotini; rinse with cold water to cool. Add cooked rotini, shrimp and lobster/crab to mixture in bowl; toss gently to mix and coat the pasta. Serve on lettuce lined plates.

## NOTE: MAKE IT SPECLAL!

Add the traditional "Louis" garnish of tomato and hard cooked egg wedges.
To take as a dish to pass for a picnic, this recipe doubles or even quadruples very easily. Enjoy! Chof $\mathscr{X}$.
