October brings out the best of Mother Nature. The air is crisp, the leaves are turning and appetites are sharpened. Here is a low fat, sugar, & salt recipe that will



satisfy the appetites and warm what needs to be warmed.

SOUTHWESTERN STEW

2 lb. beef stew meat, 1/2" cubes - 2 tbsp cooking oil - 2 cups water -- 1 1/4 cups chopped onion -- 1 cup salsa -- 2 cloves minced garlic -- 1 thsp dry parsley flakes -- 2 tsp beef bouillon granules -- 1 tsp ground cumin -- 1/2 tsp salt (optional) - 3 medium carrots, cut into 1" pieces - 1 can (14 1/2 oz) diced tomatoes, undrained -- 1 1/2 cups frozen cut green beans - 1 1/2 cups frozen corn kernels - 1 can (4 oz) chopped green chilies.

In a 4 qt. dutch oven over medium heat, brown meat in oil; drain. Add the next eight ingredients; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 1 hour. Add carrots; return to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 20 minutes. Add tomatoes, beans, corn and chilies; return to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 15 - 20 minutes or until beef and vegetables are tender. This stew is good served over hot cooked rice. Serve with warm French bread.



BANNER STEALING RULES Condensed or revised 9/8/96



- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- 2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's President at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.
- 3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an <u>additional</u> four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance.
- 4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, <u>as guests</u>, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
- 5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller is subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's President.

Tel-O-Mark Rounds meets at the West Webster United Methodist Church on Old Ridge Road every Wednesday evening beginning at 8:00 and lasting until 10:30. The






