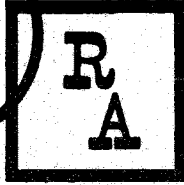

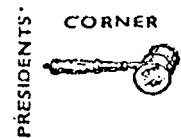

November is upon us and it won't be long before that four letter word will be in our weather forecasts.

This recipe is from Wegman's Oktoberfest recipe

card, but I'm sure you'll be using it for any occasion that calls for a simple nutritious one pan meal. Basic recipe will serve four, you may increase it proportionately to accommodate more diners.



UNSTUFFED CABBAGE

1 medium onion, chopped -- 1 lb. ground beef, 93% lean -- 1 cup enriched parboiled rice, uncooked -- 1 26 oz. jar tomato & basil pasta sauce -- 6 cups (1 medium head) shredded savoy cabbage -- 1 1/4 cup water.

1. Cook the ground beef and onions in a large non stick skillet, or fried chicken pan, on LOW until the meat is no longer pink.
2. Add the rice, sauce, cabbage and water. Salt & pepper to taste.
3. Cover and simmer on LOW for 20 minutes.
4. Serve with warm sourdough rye bread.

NOTE: For a different color and taste you may substitute red cabbage for the savoy.
