I hesitate offering this recipe so soon after Thanksgiving. Some of you probably haven't even started to make the annual soup from the carcass of the Thanksgiving bird. However, this stew is great on cold winter nights. It's a full course meal. Serve with hot biscuits so that no one misses a drop of the delicious gravy.



### HEARTY TURKEY STEW

3 tbsp olive oil - 5 medium carrots, peeled and chopped - 1 large onion, chopped - 1 lb uncooked turkey breast, cut into 1" strips - 1 tsp garlic powder - 1/2 tsp dried parsley - 3 tbsp flour - 8 small red potatoes, cut into 1/2" cubes - 1 cup sliced mushrooms - 1 cup turkey stock or reduced sodium chicken broth - 1 8 oz can tomato sauce - 1/2 tsp chili powder - 1 tsp ground cumin - 1/2 tsp paprika.

Preheat oven to 325f. In a large skillet, heat oil over medium heat, add carrots and onion, and cook until veggies are tender. Add turkey strips, garlic powder, and parsley. Cook 3 minutes or until turkey is lightly browned. Stir in flour. Pour mixture into a 3 quart casserole dish. Add potatoes, mushrooms, stock, tomato sauce, chili powder, cumin and paprika.

Bake 45 minutes, or until potatoes are tender and turkey is no longer pink in center. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

#### Why the rush to Plus?

Maybe its because there is no place for the new dancers to dance what they just spent 20 weeks learning. Maybe it's because the clubs don't want to lower the level. Clubs do lower the level in May after graduation, but if new grads do not go to plus workshops in the summer, come September, when the dancing season starts, where do they go? No place! And we have just lost our newest and best ambassadors for the square dance activity. Maybe because we as dancers associate boring dances with the Mainstream Level. This could be very true, if so, it is up to the callers to make the mainstream level challenging, interesting and enjoyable for all. You as dancers have the right to let us know if we are meeting your expectations as callers. You are the paying customers.

We need to take a hard look at how we have the program set

up in our area. Here are some ideas: 1. Start off in September with plus workshops 1/2 hour before the regular dance for those who want to: A) brush up on plus and B) for those new grads who did not go to workshops in the summer. Then dance at a lower level September through December using the workshop calls and bring everybody up to speed together. Have one or two plus tips during the evening for the seasoned plus dancers. (But not too long to have those who can't dance sit out too long). 2. Another idea is to have Mainstream dances regularly during the year to allow the new dancers to dance, enjoy and practice what they learned. This would need area wide support from both callers and dancers to make it a success. We don't need to start a Mainstream Club, but just a regularly scheduled Mainstream Dance to give the new grads a place to dance and feel like they belong. Issue them badges from the clubs they graduated from. Let them enjoy dancing then, maybe they would like to go on the plus level after becoming comfortable at the Mainstream Level.

We as a dance community need to make some hard decisions very soon to keep the activity alive. We need change to attract new prospects and to keep them. We need input from all that are involved today in Square Dancing to make it happen. If we continue to go along our current path we will lose one of the best social activities we have. Let your Caller or your Club Officers know what you think.

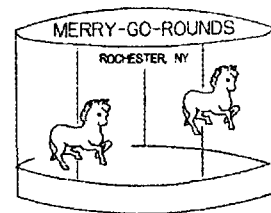
Thone on Sunday, December 8, at the Red Men Party House. You may still be able to register, so give us a call if you're interested.

They had fallen behind and were embarrassed. They dropped out of square dancing because there was no place for them to dance.

The other situation was told to me by another square dancer but it is the same story. Couple joins beginners' class at local club. Couple enjoys lessons so much that they buy the clothes and go to Dance-O-Rama. Couple graduates all enthusiastic about their new hobby. But then summer came and it is the same story. Couple can't or doesn't want to attend summer workshops because of other interests. Couple comes back in the Fall and cannot keep up. No place for couple to dance, so they drop out.

When are we going to wake up, people!! When are we going to wake up to the fact that there are people who enjoy square dancing, BUT HAVE OTHER INTERESTS AS WELL!! When are we going to wake up to the fact that not everyone is a rocket scientist and can learn Mainstream and Plus in one year? 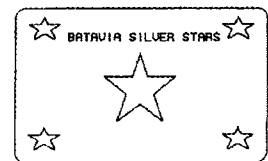
With Christmas Eve and New Years Eve falling on Tuesday this year, we won't be dancing. This gives Bob & I a chance to go to Florida for two weeks.

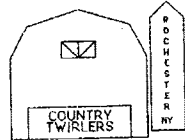

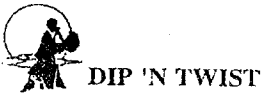
The early workshop from 7:00 - 8:00 is popular and well attended. We continue to review new figures and rhythms.

dancing with his wife.)) undecided - 13%; and none-of-the-above - 30%.

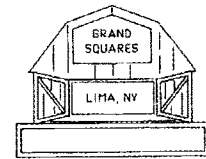
