The holidays are over. Winter is still deciding whether to stay or just tease us. Here is a very easy meal which will be enjoyed by your families and is festive enough to serve to company.

## SPAGHETTI CASSEROLE

6 oz Italian turkey sausage, casings removed, hot or mild, according to your taste - 2 small zucchini, quartered lengthwise and sliced (about 2 cups) - 1 medium onion, chopped - 2 cloves garlic, chopped - 1 can, $141 / 2 \mathrm{oz}$, stewed tomatoes - $3 / 4$ cup spaghetti, broken into $1^{\prime \prime}$ pieces $-1 / 2$ cup water - $1 / 4$ cup grated Parmesan cheese.

1. Preheat oven to 375F. Spray 2 qt. casserole with vegetable spray.
2. In a large, non-stick skillet over medium heat, cook sausage, zucchini and onion, breaking up sausage with a spoon, until zucchini is crisp tender and sausage is no longer pink, about 10 minutes. Drain off any excess fat.
3. Add garlic; cook for 1 minute. Stir in tomatoes, spaghetti and water. Transfer mixture to prepared casserole, covering the spaghetti with the liquid; cover casserole with foil.
4. Bake for 30 minutes. Remove foil and sprinkle with Parmesan. Place casserole on a wire rack; let stand for 5 minutes. Serve with plenty of warm French or Italian bread. Serve 6. Double it to feed a crowd!

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I read with great interest the articles that appeared in this last Promenader regarding new class graduates. I remember after graduating going to our first Club Dance and when the Caller said "Spin Chain The Gears" I was sure he had made an error, he must have meant "Spin Chain Through" -- needless to say our square went to complete chaos and everyone knew that we were the cause of this disaster. It was then I realized we were way over our heads going off to a Club Dance because we could not dance what they were doing. Well, yes, we went to the summer Plus sessions and learned all the things that all the other Club Dancers did.

Our Club, like most of the area Clubs, is struggling to put through a class every year. It is not easy and this past year we had 4 single ladies. Club Angels filled in as partners when they took classes. We encouraged them to attempt to interest one of their acquaintances to join them as their partner. Unfortunately they were not successful. After graduation they traveled to the Plus classes out of town, but found -- "No Partner, No Classes". We have lost 3 of these people, and are striving to save the 4th.

To try to right a wrong, our Club, the Kuntry Kuzzins in Newark, thought it might be a good idea to offer a Plus Workshop for the people who were unable to take Plus Classes this past summer, or may wish to brush up on their Pluses in general. We sent out fliers to every Square Dance Club in the Rochester Federation - The Results: NOT A SINGLE PERSON CAME. We did have 2 couples from our own Club. As Club Members, if we know of people who have dropped out, why not call them and offer to take them to a Plus Class just as we did
when we first recruited them into Square Dancing and encourage them by being an Angel. I realize we are approximately $\mathbf{3 0}$ minutes away from Rochester - how about a car pool, that's always fun.

The suggestion of holding a Plus Workshop prior to the Club Dance is a possibility, except for those Clubs who are holding their Beginners Class prior to their dance, or how about those Clubs that offer a halfhour of round dancing before their dance or line dancing. Now things really begin to get complicated.

We would like to help you save these Square Dancers and we continue to offer the Plus Class to all who would like to take advantage of it. They are cordially invited to join us on Tuesdays at 8:00 $9: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ at Kelley School, Peirson Ave., Newark. Dave Eno will be there to teach. Better yet, our new class meets prior to the Plus group from 6:30-8:00pm. Come and spend the whole evening reinforcing what has already been learned and building a new set of calls. Remember, the people who need this help probabley do not receive the Promenader, nor do they see all those lovely fliers that we put out at out Club Dances. Perhaps your Club Officers could sit down and go through your membership lists and contact some of these people who have fallen through the cracks during the past several years. It is up to us to contact them and renew their enthusiasm.
