Here is a recipe that will help relieve some of the Cabin fever these last few days of winter. It will help by having to take good care of the starter batter which has to be done before the baking can start.



AMISH FRIENDSHIP BREAD

STARTER BATTER

1/3 c flour - 1/3 c sugar - 1/3 c milk. Day 1: Pour starter into plastic container. Cover loosely. DO NOT refrigerate. Day 2, 3, 4: stir. Day 5,6,7, & 8, add 1 c each: flour, sugar, milk-stir. Pour 1 cup out and divide into 3 parts, 1/3 cup each. Give 1/3 cup starter and recipe to each of two friends. This is day 1 for them. All batters must be mixed and stored in plastic bowls.

INSTRUCTIONS

To starter batter add:

3 eggs - 2/3 c oil - 2 c flour - 1 c sugar - 1 1/4 ts baking powder - 1 1/2 ts cinnamon - 1/4 ts salt - 1/2 ts baking soda - 1 c chopped nuts or raisins (optional).

Pour into greased and sugared pans. Bake at 350F for 50 to 55 minutes. Check after 45 minutes. (Can be put in 3 small loaf pans.)

ATTENTION ALL A2 DANCERS: We invite you for an evening of dancing on-the-house on Thursday, April 24. Our

"house" is the North Street School in Geneva, where we will be dancing from 8:00 to 10:30 p.m. The school is at the flashing light on North Street on the North side of Geneva, about a mile west of the Route 14 intersection - the first traffic signal on 14 south of the Thruway. Enter at the flashing light and go straight back then left behind the building. (Rochester dancers note: we find it to be less than an hour from our house in northern Irondequoit.)

Three hundred seventy-four years!! That's how much dancing experience was assembled at a recent dance. (And that doesn't include those who have flown to warmer dancing.) The range of experience goes from the Carleys who began western square dancing 43 years ago (and helped found three clubs along the way), to the Frankenfields who began in 1995. Several couples, including the Bonnetts, Ruegers and Lilyeas, got their start in eastern square dancing. It must have been a romantic activity - Linda and Roy first met while dancing at Bar's Barn, while Eva and George met at a dance at the Match Box. (Must still be: Tony & Sid Marshall of Cloverleafs, for example.)

Our survey also found that, although dancers may have to drop out for a while because of family, work or health, they are delighted when they return. (The Goulds were out for 20 years and we were out for 10). So, don't count yourselves out if you have to drop out. It seems to get in the blood.

If you missed the Mid Term Ball, you missed a great evening. The attendance was very good (35 club couples and 22 class couples). Bruce


