

As a result of the "Club President's/CCR/Federation Officers meeting" on April 6th, the Square Dance community is going to try a new approach this fall. The majority of the Clubs are going to attempt to recruit new dancers to take 8-10 week lessons thru the Adult Education programs in several of the towns. Let's all get behind it with our full support! Here is a good chance to arouse the interest of some potential Square Dancers.

Summer is almost upon us and it sure seems good to look forward to at least a couple of months of warm weather. While I was recuperating I had plenty of time to find some really good recipes.

Here is a good one. Maybe we'll find out if real men eat quiche!!

BROCCOLI QUICHE

1 9' unbaked pie shell - 2 cups chopped fresh broccoli, cooked and drained, or 2 (10 ounce) packages frozen chopped broccoli thawed and drained - 1 whole chicken breast, (two halves) cooked and cut into 1" pieces - 6 oz Swiss cheese (I use light or no fat), cut into 1/4" cubes - 3 eggs (I use egg substitute) - 1 cup heavy cream (I use light cream or half and half) - 2 tbsp lemon juice - 1 tsp salt (optional) - 1/8 tsp pepper - chopped chives.


Refrigerate pie shell for 30 minutes. Place pie shell in 9" pie pan and crimp edges. Preheat oven to 375F. Sprinkle broccoli in bottom of shell. Top with chicken, then cheese.

In small bowl, using wire whisk, beat eggs, cream, lemon juice, salt & pepper until blended, but not frothy. Pour over cheese mixture; sprinkle with chives. Bake for 35-40 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Let stand for 10 minutes before cutting. Serves 6 - 8.



years. Thank you!


We appreciate the many guests who supported us during the past quarter century. It was a pleasure to dance with you.




Our season ended with some new Copy Kittens ioining our Club. We have 8 new kittens, and they have all done very well in class, we are happy to have them
