

I've been checking over all the recipes since we started this column. I have found that there have not been any recipes for the "Bread machines" that I know many of you have. Here's a good one that I gleaned from the Prodigy

network way back in 1993.

NEW YORK-FLORIDA RYE BREAD

1 pk active dry yeast - 6 tsp gluten - 6 tsp buttermilk powder - 1 tsp salt - 3 tsp butter - 1 ½ cups water - 1 cup rye flour - 3 cups bread flour - 3 tsp honey - 1 ½ tbs caraway seeds.

This recipe is for the big $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 lb. bread machine, if yours has a smaller capacity just scale down the quantity of ingredients. Add the ingredients to the pan per your machine's instructions. Set mode to white bread. Sit back and let the machine do all the messy work. The aromas will fill the house, so don't be surprised if your family is lined up waiting for the loaf to be finished.


Turkey Dance is set for Nov. 24. Everyone is invited to join us for a really fun evening.






Our Halloween Dance on October 25 went very well and people in costume had a great time keeping people guessing who they are.


Items to be auctioned off during tips. Come out, and get a few things for the holidays, while you have a great time dancing with us.

Western, Eastern and Circle dances and Will Herzog directing a country line dance.


After bobbing for apples, we'll compete in an apple peeling contest. Perhaps the winner will get to take home all the 'contestants' and can quickly make applesauce!
