## Creamy Seafood Linguine

8 oz linguine - 1 tablespoon olive oil - $1 / 2$ cup finely chopped onions - 5 garlic cloves, minced - 3 tablespoons dry white wine - 1 tablespoon cornstarch - 1 cup evaporated skim milk - $1 / 2$ teaspoon ground coriander - 8 oz large shrimp, peeled and deveined - 8 oz bay scallops - 3 tablespoons snipped fresh parsley - $1 / 2$ teaspoon salt $-1 / 8$ teaspoon pepper.

Cook the pasta according to package directions. Drain and set aside. If necessary, cover to keep warm. Meanwhile, lightly spray an unheated large skillet with olive oil no-stick spray. Add the oil and heat over medium high heat. Add the onions and garlic. Cook and stir about 5 minutes or until the onions are golden brown. In a small custard cup, stir together the wine and cornstarch until smooth. Stir the wine mixture and milk into the onion mixture. Bring the mixture to a simmer over medium heat, stirring constantly. Reduce the heat. Stir in the coriander and cook for 1 minute. Then add the shrimp and scallops. Return to a simmer. Simmer, uncovered for 3 to 5 minutes or until the shrimp turn pink and the scallops are opaque. Stir in the parsley, salt and pepper. Serve on top of the hot pasta. Makes 4 servings. ## LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

When you're at your round dance club or in the round dance hall at a festival, look around and see how many never square danced before. Yes, your floor may be filled now, but how long do you think this will last?

The fact is that virtually all round dancers and round dance cuers entered the activity as a square dancer first. There is no indication this will change. In its basic form, round and square dancing are unequivocally tied together and round dancing feeds off square dancing. There are areas of the country where there are only square dance clubs, but there are no areas where there are only round dance clubs. If you accept this and are aware of the reduction of new square dancers entering into the activity, then eventually this must filter down and influence the influx of new round dancers. Round dancing as we know it cannot survive without square dancing.

People who now only round dance need to change their attitude and look to supporting a square dance club if you wish your round dance clubs to flourish. With competition from modern technology and all the other alternatives for people's time, cooperation is needed to at least maintain the existence of square dance clubs which are much reduced in number and size from ten years ago.

Minimal support of a square dance club means that at the very least, help to bring new people into its class and attend the class as an angel until the people you bring are integrated into it. Who knows, you may even have fun in the process. If you attend the club dances, your presence may also influence a round dance program in it. In some clubs there is no round dancing because there are no round dancers. If the club cannot afford a cuer, perhaps you can convince your cuer to donate an occasional evening or work for a small feee commensurate with the number of participants. We must all pull together or it is very likely the activity we enjoy will one day cease to exist.
