Here it is March and many of us are starting to feel the sap rising with the coming of spring. I'm sorry to say that the month of March has not always been kind to us here in western New York. Some of our significant snowstorms over the past 2 decades have come in this challenging month. Here is a recipe that will take the chill off those chilly evenings.

## RATATOVILLE WITH SAUSAGE

4 Italian sausage links (hot or mild to taste) - 1 large onion, sliced - 1 large green bell pepper, cubed - 1 large red bell pepper, cubed - 1 bay leaf, crushed - 1 thyme - 3 fresh tomatoes, $1^{\prime \prime}$ cubes - 4 T olive oil - 2 cloves garlic, chopped - 1 med. eggplant, 1 " cubes unpeeled - 2 med zucchini, halved and sliced, $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}-1 / 4$ c parsley, chopped - 1 T basil - mozzarella cheese, shredded.

Cook the sausage, set aside. Wash and prepare all vegetables. Use two skillets, heat $1 / 2$ of the oil in each. Add half the onions, garlic and peppers to each, stir fry 2 to 3 minutes. Add the zucchini to one and the eggplant to the other. Stir the eggplant for 3 minutes and the zucchini for 1 minute. Season each with bay leaf, parsley, basil, thyme, salt and freshly ground pepper. Slice the sausage into $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ pieces and add half to each skillet, along with half of the cubed tomatoes. Spoon portions from each skillet into individual ramekins. Top with a generous layer of mozzarella cheese and bake in a 350F oven for 15 minutes or until the cheese is melted and bubbly. Serve with warm French bread.
NOTE 1: For variety, use 1 zucchini and 1 yellow squash.
NOTE 2: You may use farmer's cheese or skim milk mozzarella to reduce fats.

It is with great regret that we announce the closing of the Merry-Go-Rounds effective March 1. This is a decision that is the result of considerable thought, mulling over, gut wrenching, and hair pulling. This was certainly a very difficult decision for us. The reasons are two-fold:

First, over the past year, attendance is down about $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$ and expenses are up about $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$. That's a huge gap to make up and it has been difficult for us to carry. Secondly, with Bill's job situation, he needs to focus more time on finding or keeping a new job. If he's still looking as of March 1, closing the club will take one activity off his already very busy plate. If he is in a new job by then, regardless of whether or not it's in the Rochester area, he will need to give it $150 \%$ of his effort to maximize the chances of keeping it.

We have tremendously enjoyed the $6 \frac{1}{2}$ years of Merry-Go-Rounds! The hardest part of this decision is not seeing all the people week after week. It's the people who make or break any activity, and the people we have played with for many years have certainly made it for us.

As long as we are still in the area (which we hope will be for a long time, but time will tell), we will still be available for cueing engagements and private lessons. We encourage all of you to continue dancing with the other outstanding round dance leaders in the area. One of the blessings we have in this area is a wealth of round dancing - pretty unique compared with most of the rest of the state. Take advantage of it while you can!
