Who could fulfill God's purpose as completely as a MOTHER!







Spring has finally arrived and I guess many of you are planning to get in some yard and garden work. Here's a good recipe for those days that you either don't want to stop to cook or

wait for the time it will take for the food to be ready. This will be ready when you get hungry.

HERBED MUSHROOM ROUND STEAK (Crock Pot)

2 lb round steak cut 3/4" thick - 1 Tablespoon cooking oil - 1 medium onion, sliced - 2 cups sliced fresh mushrooms - 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup - 1/4 cup dry white wine (optional) - $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon dried oregano - 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme - 1/4 teaspoon pepper - 3 cups hot cooked noodles.

Trim any fat from meat; cut into serving size portions. In a large skillet, brown on both sides in hot oil.

In a $3\frac{1}{2}$ or 4 qt crock pot, place onions and mushrooms. Place meat on top of vegetables.

In a small bowl, combine soup, wine (if desired), oregano, thyme and pepper; pour over meat.

Cover and cook on low heat setting for 8 to 10 hours or on high heat for 4 to 5 hours. Serve over hot cooked noodles.

Makes 4 to 6 servings.


The B'S Trail-Out Dance on the 15th will begin with a pot luck dinner. All our friends are welcome to join us. Just bring something good to share and your table service.
