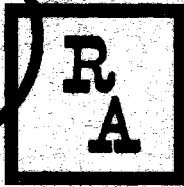

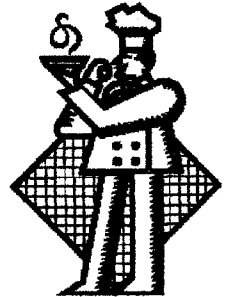

Chef's Corner...

Sorry I missed the deadline last month and I promise never to do that any more. October can still be a busy month with finishing the yard work before the (four letter word) SNOW flies and finally getting the kids settled into their school routines. Here is a great recipe for those nights when a simple, but delicious meal will warm your heart and body.



NO-GUILT CHICKEN POT PIE

1 can cond. 98% fat-free cream of chicken soup
 1 pkg. (9 oz.) frozen mixed vegetables
 1 cup cubed cooked chicken — I used canned!
 1/2 cup skim milk
 1 egg or equiv. (Egg Beaters)
 1 cup Bisquick reduced-fat baking mix

Preheat oven to 400°F. Mix soup, vegetables and chicken in a medium bowl; place in a 9" pie plate. In another bowl mix milk, egg and baking mix. Pour over chicken mixture using a wooden spoon or spatula, smooth out to edges to seal. Bake 30 minutes, or until golden brown. Serves 4. (With thanks to Campbell's Soups)

Only 8g fat per serving. Traditional recipe, 43g fat per serving.

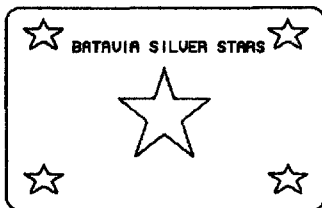


Club News ...

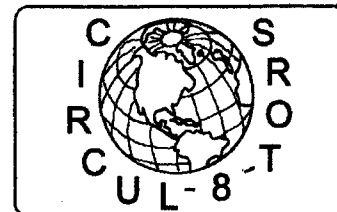
We look forward to the start of a "new class." We will have "favorite dessert" night on 10/15, and our annual Hal-loween party on Oct. 29.

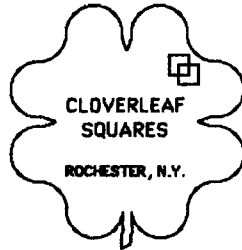

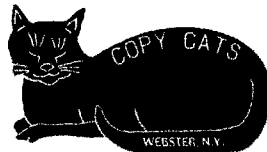

We start the month with Jerry Carmen calling and cueing our HOB0 dance on October 3. Come dressed as a hobo if you wish and enjoy the fun.

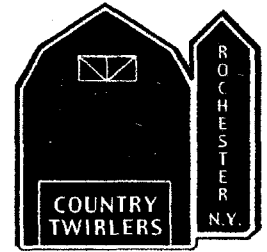
