October can still be a busy month with finishing the yard work before the (four letter word) SNOW flies and finally getting the kids settled into their school routines. Here is a great recipe for those nights when a simple, but deliclous meal will warm your heart and body.

## NO-GUILT CHICKEN POT PIE

1 can cond. $98 \%$ fat-free cream of chicken soup 1 pkg . ( 9 oz .) frozen mixed vegetables
1 cup cubed cooked chicken - l used canned! $1 / 2$ cup skim milk
1 egs or equiv. (Egg Beaters)
1 cup Bisquick reduced-fat baking mix


Preheat oven to $400^{\circ}$. Mix soup, vegetables and chicken in a medium bowl; place in a $9^{\prime \prime}$ pie plate. In another bowl mix milk, egg and baking mix. Pour over chicken mixture using a wooden spoon or spatula, smooth out to edges to seal. Bake 30 minutes, or until golden brown. Serves 4. (With thanks to Campbell's Soups)
