

Chef's Corner...

Hopefully Halloween is a fond memory and we are settling in for the coming wintery weather. Here is a relatively simple and heart warming recipe which is both tasty and quickly made.

TURKEY EGGPLANT BAKE

- 1/2 lb. ground turkey
- 1 one-lb. eggplant
- 1 small zucchini
- 1 small yellow squash
- 1/2 cup chopped red onion
- 1/2 cup chopped red bell pepper or 1/2 cup chopped green bell pepper
- 1 tsp dried oregano
- 1/2 tsp dried basil
- 1/4 tsp crushed fennel seed

1/4 tsp garlic powder -1/4 tsp salt 1 cup soft cubed whole wheat bread

1/2 cup shredded farmer cheese.

Microwave turkey at high for 5 to 7-1/2 minutes, or until no longer pink, stirring to break apart. Set aside. Cut zucchini and squash in half lengthwise and slice thin. Cut eggplant in half lengthwise. Scoop out pulp, leaving 1/4" shells. Cut pulp into 1/2" cubes. Add all ingredients, except bread cubes and cheese. Mix" well. Microwave at high for 12 to 18 minutes, or until eggplant is translucent and flavors are blended, stirring 3 or 4 times. Stir in bread cubes. Place eggplant shells in square casserole, cut side up. Stuff evenly with meat mixture; cover and microwave at high for 6 to 12 minutes, or until shells are tender. Rotate dish occasionally. Sprinkle with cheese. Let stand, covered, until cheese is melted. Serve with warm crusty French or Italian bread. Serves 4 polite diners or 2 really hungry ones.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

We would like your assistance in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. The Award is presented at Dance-O-Rama. However, even though Dance-O-Rama is sponsored by The Rochester Area Federation, it does not govern, sponsor or present the Award. It is governed by and presented by the Selection Committee. We need you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for The Award.

The Original Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; *Promenader*; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions and Answers

We have tried to think of some of the questions you may have. Hopefully, we have answered at least some of them:

Q: Who is the Selection Committee?

The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. Being that Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank has asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are: John & Daphne Fink, Walt & Sally Baechle, Chip Kellogg & Sue Yara, Bob & Nora Slomcenski and Carl & Elaine Mallaber.

Q: How do people get nominated?

Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Carl & Elaine Mallaber, 15 Willard Ave., Phelps, NY 14513, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected?

Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or updated information should be sent. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info. Nominator: Name, address and phone number

3) Club organizations & participation

4) Local organizations & participation (both dance and other)

5) State organization & participation (both dance and other)

6) National organizations & participation (both dance and other)



November 21 will be our annual "PIE NIGHT." This is a popular and fun night and many people go home with a pie. Bring a pie if you wish or just come and enjoy.






Dancing Shadows

Réportes, Marje Aude **Recently**, at a club dance, someone lost their footing and fell while dancing, and it was difficult for the caller to see what had happened. IT IS IMPORTANT that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.



ECIVIA Emergency Call for Medical Aid

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

- **STEP ONE:** When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- **STEP TWO:** Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.
- **STEP THREE**: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- **STEP FOUR:** On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, to our knowledge, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.

It's back by popular demand! The Village Squares Barn Dance. We hope to raise the roof of East Rochester's First Presbyterian Church with an old fash-





2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance.

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (nonpaying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.


