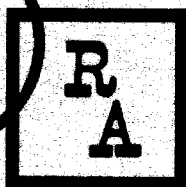

Chef's Corner...

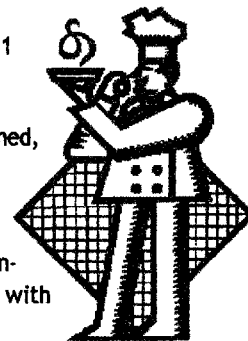
The holidays and their hustle & bustle are behind us. It's time for us to take a well deserved rest. Here's a quick, (less than a half hour,) and nourishing dish for the chilly nights.

The chef wishes to thank the Wegmans.com web site for this and many more wonderful recipes.

SPINACH TORTELLINI SOUP

- 1 small onion chopped
- 5 cups chicken broth
- 2 carrots, peeled and thinly sliced (about 1 cup)
- 1 pkg. (8 oz.) of cheese or meat tortellini
- 1/2 of a 10 oz. pkg. of fresh spinach, washed, trimmed and coarsely chopped.

Combine onion, carrots, and broth; bring to a boil. Add tortellini, reduce heat and simmer 4 minutes. Add spinach and simmer 4 minutes longer, until carrots are tender. Serve with warm Italian or French bread.

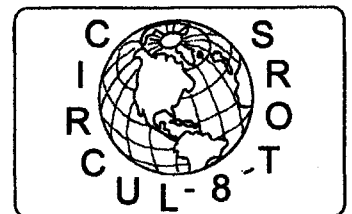


Our Super Bowl Night was a huge success, full of fun and dancing. Michael Callahan was our caller and cuer on January 27 and we all had a grand time.

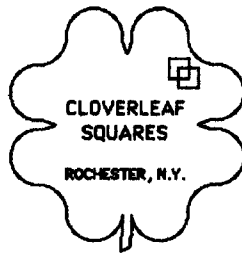

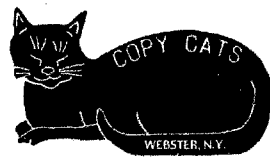

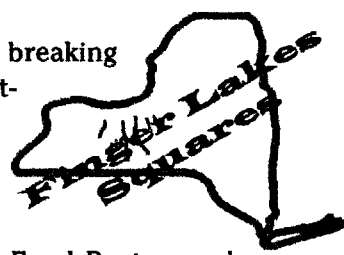
Finger Lakes Squares
