

He has taught classes from the Basic Level thru Challenge and is currently calling for the Seven Valley Whirlaways of McGraw and the JD Squares of Oneida.


Jerry and his wife, Ardis, make their home in Oneida, NY. They have two grown children and he is a current member of Callerlab and the Central NY Association.

She currently calls regularly for five square dance clubs (Basic thru C3A) as well as conducting callers' clinics and (Continued on next page)


Callers Co-Op ... to all Square and Round Dance Clubs...

CHEF'S CORNER...

Here it is April and Easter will be soon be upon us. This is also the time when our thoughts turn to garden and lawn care. This recipe will be a perfect way to have a meal ready when you come in from a day in the garden and/or yard work, or a day at the nursery or garden shop.

CROCKPOT CHICKEN STROGANOFF

- 6 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves
- 1 lg. container of sour cream (fat free if you are watching fat intake)
- 1 can low fat cream of mushroom soup
- 1 pkg. Lipton's dry onion soup mix.

Mix all ingredients together and put into the crockpot. Cook on low for 4 to 6 hours or until chicken is tender and cooked through. Serve over cooked no-yolk noodles or hot cooked rice.
