CHEF'S CORNER...

Now that all of the year end vacations are over and the artificial trees are repacked and put away, and the fresh trees have been placed at the curb for the trash pick-up, here is a tasty meal to greet you when you return home from work.

CASSOULET EN POT (CROCK POT)

1/2 lb. bulk pork sausage

2 15-oz. cans of black-eyed peas, not drained -

1 small onion, sliced

1 clove garlic, minced

1/2 lb. cooked ham, cubed

2 tbs minced parsley - 1/4 cup dry white wine.

In skillet, cook sausage until lightly browned. Pour off excess fat. In crock pot arrange alternate layers of sausage, onion, garlic, parsley, black-eyed peas, and ham. Pour wine over all. Cover and cook on low for 5 to 7 hours,

or until you return from work. Mixture will be quite soupy, so serve in bowls. Serve with plenty of crusty French or Italian bread to sop up all the tasty juices.

Serves six polite diners or two really hungry ones.

President's Corner

There are many theories that try to explain the problem of decline in the square dance community. We were recently given an article from the *American Callers Association Newsletter* from Oct. '99, and would like to share part of it with you.

The author stated that most class people, when asked what attracted them to square dancing, answered, "the music, fun and fellowship."


He continues, "ACA has already stated what we have found to be needed to turn square dancing around and we stand by our statement. After twenty-five years of all the levels, it seems that anyone can see that the levels have not worked for the betterment of square dancing.

Most people who would like to square dance now — cannot because they do not have a year to learn to dance. If we are to get people involved in square dancing now, we must have a program that fits their time constraints. Look around and see how many square dance clubs in your area are not plus or advance clubs.

State conventions tell us a lot about our activity. It has been reported to us that at a recent state convention there were 14 halls with no more than 5 squares in each hall (some less than this). But, at a recent Arkansas state convention, there were 61 squares on one floor! This is what made our activity great to start with, everyone enjoying square dancing together — not 14 separate halls."

Many recent local dances like the *Promenader* Benefit Dance (20 squares), Gary Bubel's three clubs & new dancers Xmas party (16 squares), seem to confirm this theory.

This is what the DOR 2000 committee is hoping to accomplish with your support. Remember, "Together we cannot lose"!





March 23 we will have Jerry Devaul as our caller and Jeanne Harter as cuer. This is always a fun dance.


