

CHEF'S CORNER...

April has crept up on us and here we are finding all the seed catalogs in the mail. Hopefully the snow (four letter word!) has melted and some of the crocus and other hardy plants are starting to peek up through the soil with the promise of spring!

Here is a simple, quick and very tasty supper for those days when it is difficult to come in out of the gardens.

CHICKEN WITH PINE NUTS

- 3 T olive oil
- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves cut in half
- I med. Onion; chopped fine
- 1 red bell pepper; seeded and chopped
- 1 (or more to taste) garlic clove; chopped
- 1 t flour

salt & pepper to taste

- 1 1/2 T parsley; chopped
- 1 cup pine nuts
- 1/2 cup dry sherry

Heat the oil in a skillet over high heat. Sauté chicken until brown on both sides. Remove from skillet. Sauté the onion until soft, add the bell pepper and sauté a few minutes longer. Stir in garlic, flour, salt & pepper. Add parsley, pine nuts, chicken and sherry, stirring well. Simmer 10 minutes over low heat, until the chicken is cooked through, adding a little water or wine if the dish looks too dry. Serve over hot cooked pasta or rice. Serve with crusty Italian or French bread to mop up any juices that may be begging to be eaten!

At least 15 of the 25 clubs must be affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 non-affiliated clubs can be used, including Dance-O-Rama.

The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club

booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the ticket table.
