

CHEF'S CORNER...

Here is a different recipe for some really tasty chicken wings. With the BBQ season upon us, try this one for guests, family or anyone walking by.

This is a favorite here at the chalet. I've doubled the recipe and taken it to potlucks, never any left.

SWEET & SOUR CHICKEN WINGS

1 pound chicken wings, disjointed 2 beaten eggs cornstarch

SAUCE:

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup vinegar
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons catsup
- 2 teaspoons soy sauce

• Mix all ingredients for the sauce; stir to blend. Bring to a boil, reduce heat to simmer and simmer sauce for 5 minutes.

• Meanwhile, salt and pepper the wings, dredge in cornstarch. Deep fry, in batches, until golden brown. Sauce should be ready by thistime.

• Dip wings in sauce. Place in baking pan. Pour remaining sauce over wings. Bake 30 to 40 minutes at 300°F.



THE DAPHNE=NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

On May 6, at the 2000 Dance-O-Rama, held at Ada Cosgrove Middle School, **Bill and Joan Newman** received the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. This award highlights extensive and sustained leadership over an extended period of years in square, round, or contra dancing. It was established in 1977 by Frank Salvagio and John Fink in honor of their wives, Norma and Daphne. Candidates are evaluated on the basis of leadership, service, and motivation.

The Newmans have been promoting dancing of all kinds for more than 15 years. They have introduced people to the fun and fellowship it can offer, in the class and the community. They have shared with "students" of all ages the joy of Round Dancing. And in doing so, they have been planting and nurturing seeds for the future, many of which have borne fruit in new round and square dancers alike.

This couple started their round and square dancing in the Washington, DC area in the early 1960s and also danced in the Baltimore, Maryland, area before moving to Geneva in 1963. There was no dancing available in Geneva upon their arrival, and once they were settled in, they played a large role in establishing the Geneva Friendship Squares, which eventually led to the sponsorship of the Penn Yan Friendship Squares. They have held positions of various capacities in the Geneva Club for many years.

Bill has been and continues to be the cuer for the Geneva Friendship Squares and remains active with the club. He also has been guest cuer at many locations throughout the state. He has cued at D.O.R. many times, and one time filled in, at the last minute, for a national cuer who couldn't make it. Many times the Newmans have had out of town callers or cuers stay at their home while they were in the area. They both were actively involved with the NYS Square Dance Festival when it was held.

Over the years, Geneva was very fortunate to have a physician/surgeon with Bill's expertise and commitment. He is also known in the area for his singing capability. He sang in the Presbyterian Church choir, a community interfaith choral group, for many years, and has been soloist at numerous weddings, community functions and special occasions throughout the area.

Joan was very active in the Geneva Hospital Auxiliary and particularly for her work in organizing the "Follies" which has held on a yearly basis as a fund raiser for the Hospital. This show was held each year at the Smith Opera House in Geneva and recognized as a very successful community fund-raiser function. Many organizations have asked for her expertise in organizational skills. She accepted these requests with willingness, eagerness and ease.

Bill and Joan are members of the Historical Society and

the Smith Opera House and have participated in many functions for these organizations. And they have been judges at dance contests for the talent shows held at the Smith Opera House.

At the April 12, 2000 Federation meeting, the rules for banner stealing were reviewed. The consensus of the meeting was that there needed to be flexibility in the rules. If a club was not able to muster enough couples to steal and/or retrieve a banner, the target club could agree to fewer couples participating. It was pointed out that the goal of banner stealing is to encourage the clubs to intermingle.

For our readers' convenience, the rules are reprinted here. If there are any questions, please check with the Federation.



1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club. 3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.



E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

Emergency Call for Medical Aid

- **STEP ONE:** When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.
- **STEP TWO:** Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.
- **STEP THREE:** Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.
- **STEP FOUR:** On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.

If possible, post it at your dances.





