CHEF'S CORNER...

I'm still trying to get my mind adjusted to plan recipes for this column. I hope I will be able to provide you all with recipes that are in line with the season, or at least not too far out of sync. Here is a recipe that can be used to supply treats for the new season of dancing.

KNOCK YOU NAKEDS

1 pkg. German chocolate cake mix.1 cup nuts, chopped.

1/3 cup evaporated milk.

3/4 cup butter, melted.

60 pcs. caramel candy.

1/2 cup evaporated milk.

1 cup chocolate chips.

Combine and mix well, cake mix, nuts, 1/3 cup milk, and butter. Press half of the mixture into the bottom of a greased 8" X 13" Pyrex baking dish; bake at 350°F for 8 minutes. Melt the caramel candies in top of a double boiler with 1/2 cup milk. When caramel mixture is well mixed, pour over baked mixture. Cover with chocolate chips and cover with rest of dough on top of the chips. Bake for 18 minutes at 350°F. Cool completely before cutting into squares. Yields 18 to 20 squares of pure chocolaty decadence.

President's Corner


Thanks to all those who worked so hard to make the open houses successful. Let's continue to support our new dancers and work together for the well-being of all clubs.

The Care and Feeding of Petticoats...

Is it time for your petticoat to be freshened up? Were you happy with the petticoat after its last laundering? Was it bright white or a dingy gray-ish white? Everybody has their favorite method of refurbishing the petticoat. Here are a few of the most popular methods of sprucing it up.

First of all, lets look at getting that netting back to a crisp color, even white. The most "tried and true" method is to usel cup of Cascade automatic dish washer detergent to one washer tub of very warm to hot water on a setting of "pre-soak." After the petticoat, waist encircling the center washer post, has completed its prewash cycle, rinse it thoroughly or run through a regular wash cycle.

Now the slip is ready to spread over an open umbrella which has been propped up between pillows of the couch. Pull out the lace and layers of tulle or nylon. Allow to dry completely (usually overnight) before removing.

Nothing pulls down a petticoat faster than being hung. Add weight of the water and before long that petticoat is truly flat. Drying a petticoat on top of an open umbrella helps to eliminate or, at least slow down the going flat process.

The following materials can be used to put the pouf back into your petticoats:

"Future" floor wax (or any of the acrylic floor waxes which will not yellow), and a round oil pan (look for clean, new one) or use a bathtub or large sink. Dip the clean petticoat into the pan into which you've poured about one

quart of acrylic floor wax. Make sure the whole petticoat is saturated. Pull upward by the waistband, allowing the floor wax to drip into the pan (save the excess wax to use another time). When dripping has ceased, shake lightly, then spread petticoat over an old, open umbrella to catch the wayward drips of floor wax. Preferably dry the petticoat outside on the patio (not in direct sunlight); but if weather is inclement, spread papers on the floor under the umbrella to catch the wayward drips of floor wax. Dry thoroughly before removing; your petticoat will be stiff again.

A second way of stiffing is to use powdered milk. Yep, that's right. powdered milk!! Mix 1 cup Carnation (doesn't leave an odor) powdered milk with 3 cups water; blend well. Dip petticoat in mixture and allow to soak up all of the mixture. Spread out to dry. The milk may tend to stain the umbrella or carpeting, so be prepared.

Here's another idea that works. Use 3 oz. of Elmers White Glue to 3 quarts of water. Dunk the petticoat, thoroughly saturating the skirt, and allow to drip excess liquid. Spread over your umbrella and dry.

If you don't want to be bothered with the drip and dry methods, try this one. Wash and spin dry your petticoat. Lay it on a flat surface or on a hanger and spray each layer with spray starch. Quickly place in dryer and dry at low temperature for a couple of minutes. One can of spray usually does three petticoats.

Pointers for Good Angeling ... From the Promenader Files

Do...be quiet while the caller is talking or calling; don't drown him out, don't say or do anything that will distract the student from what the caller is saying. Especially don't try to add helpful comments, because you will only confuse the poor student who is trying to listen to two different sets of instructions at the same time.

DO... listen carefully while the caller is talking or calling: show the students by example that the caller needs and deserves their full attention. Who knows? Maybe you will learn something about the basic calls that slipped past you the first time around.

DO...listen carefully to what the caller is saying: be sure you understand what he wants the students to do and exactly how he wants them to do it. And do it that way yourself. Don't introduce twirls and other flourishes to the class, and especially don't substitute a swing for a proper dosado; they'll learn bad habits soon enough without your help.

DO...help the students by being exactly where you are supposed to be at all times. Be guideposts to help the stu-



dents locate themselves, and teach them by example how important is precise positioning.


DO...by your example, teach the dancers to take hands whenever possible. Among several other advantages, this is a great source of guidance and assurance to the students. But your guidance should be confined to gentle hints; don't try to push or pull them around. They will learn much faster and better when they are allowed to make their own mistakes. Pointing or some other hand ges-

ture will often be enough. Verbal comments should be limited to a quick "turn left," "stand still," etc., said in a low voice to someone who is right next to you, if you see they are confused in the middle of a movement.

Pointers for Good Angeling... continued from previous page

DO...after the end of a tip, tell the caller about anyone who seems to be having special difficulty with a movement. Don't try to straighten him/her/them out by yourself. Send them to the caller for extra help, even if they ask you questions about the square dance movements. Besides giving the students an answer straight from the horse's mouth, it will also help the caller to keep in touch with the progress of his class.

DO...remember that you are there to help the class learn. Good Angels on the floor will help them learn faster, but the main reason for having angels is to fill in squares so that no class member has to sit out and miss the practice that they need so much. The class members could get through a lot of material if there were three couples of expert dancers in each set, but remember that the important thing is for them to learn for themselves how to dance when there aren't a lot of angels around.

DO...reassure the students when they do something right. Mostly, a smile and a nod are enough.

DO...remember that people learn things at different

rates and degrees of ease. Be especially friendly and encouraging to the ones who learn more slowly than others. Very often these, with help lasting through the class and after graduation too, will become very good dancers and still be supporting the club long after the hot-shots have either gone on to "higher" things or have burned themselves out and disappeared.

DO...give the caller a compliment once in a while for something he's done well. He's human too, and appreciates a kind word just like the rest of us.

DO...sit down and make friends with the class members during the rest periods, instead of gath-

ering in one corner, in a walled camp of club members.

DO...Above all, DO remember that you are not only helping the class members learn to dance, but also playing an important part in forming their attitude toward the square dance world, and your own club in particular.
