



The Holiday's are upon us. We are in the thick of cruising the malls looking for the perfect gift for uncle Joe ${\rm th}$ aunt Nellie,

cousin Sue and nephew Billy. Halfway through the shopping we stop with a sudden panic, what will we have for dinner tonight?? Here is a saving thought, "crock pot! " and a recipe to go with it! Also a bonus recipe for an aperitif before dinner to relax before the rest of the family gets home.

CROCK POT LEMON CHICKEN

- 6 chicken thighs without skin (or boneless)
- 1/2 cup flour
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp balsamic vinegar
- 3 tbs catsup
- 3 tbs brown sugar
- 6 oz. lemonade, frozen concentrate
- 2 tbs cornstarch
- 1/4 cup water

1. Our son and daughter-in-law have adopted a second girl, Lauren Claire Newman, and she is lovely, as is her older sister, Meghan Lynn Newman.



Dredge the chicken in flour mixed with salt. Shake off excess and brown in a hot skillet. Remove chicken and put in the crock pot. CARAWAY FLAVORED VODKA (TMINNAIS VODKA)

- 2 tbs caraway seeds
- 1 liter bottle of vodka

Put the caraway seeds in the vodka and replace the cap. Let sit at room temperature for 1 to 3 weeks. Strain and return the vodka to the bottle. Serve well chilled. Better get this started so that it will be ready for the holidays!

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

We would like your assistance in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award. The Award is presented at Dance-O-Rama. However, even though Dance-O-Rama is sponsored by the Rochester Area Federation, it does not govern, sponsor or present the Award. It is governed by and presented by the Selection Committee. We need you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for The Award.

The Original Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTEN-SIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EX-

TENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions and Answers You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Sally Baechle, Carl & Elaine Mallaber, Ken & Kay Georger, and Bill and Joan Newman. Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Bill and Joan Newman, 55 Snell Road, Geneva, NY 14456, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously

nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or up-

dated information should be sent. There is

nothing wrong with sending in another nomi-

In Memoriam

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the loss of Walter F. Baechle, who passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.

Walt and his wife, Sally, started dancing in 1973, and quickly became active in square dancing leadership, not only on the local level, but also on the state and national levels. The Baechles played active leadership roles in several area clubs, as well as the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., serving in many leadership capacities, including president. They were on the Board for the Empire State Festival, were members of Legacy, and United Square Dancers of America, where they held a number of offices, including vice-presidents for the Eastern Region, and also served as Board members. They were recipients of the Daphne Norma Leadership Award, and also the Circle of Service Award.

A memorial plaque on an acrylic frame was presented to Sally Baechle as a tribute to Walt from the Federation, its officers, representatives, and members, on Saturday, October 21, 2000 at Country Twirlers where she and Walt very often danced. The plaque reads as follows:

Baechle and in recognition of Walter and Sally Baechle for their many years of dedication in promoting square dancing in the Rochester area as past presidents of the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, as past recipients of the distinguished Daphne-Norma Award, as Regional Vice-Presidents of the United Square Dancers of America and members of its executive committee for many years, and as Publicity Chairpersons for the June 2000 National Convention,

In Memoriam

Many in the Rochester square dance community attended the Funeral Mass for Margaret O'Hara, who died at the age of 91 on Oct. 1, 2000.

Margaret and her husband, John, who predeceased her, were members of the Genesee Dancers, the second class that they had. They learned to dance at lessons held at The Barn in Henrietta (on what is now county fairgrounds property), and they danced at Cutler Union on University Ave., which was then part of the women's campus of the U of R.

The O'Haras later danced with Swinging Eights, and joined the Country Twirlers in 1971, where they were members for close to 8 years. They learned round dancing around 1960 from Charlie Tucker, the first person to cue round dancing in Rochester, Later Mike Prado took over, and they were members of his round dancing club. Both Margaret and John were members of Good Counsel Seniors, and Holy Family Senior Club.

Margaret was also a member of St. Helen's Widow's Club,and a former resident of Rochester Presbyterian Home.

She was the mother of Kay Georger. Kay and her husband, Ken, are presidents of the Country Twirlers, and past presidents of the Federation.

Boots 'N Slippers


Congratulations to Betty and Andy Ludwick and staff for the wonderful Benefit Dance they put on for us.

e-mail update ..

Dear Reporters and other interested dancers...

This issue, we received more e-mails than ever before! Based on this experience, here are our suggestions for submitting material by e-mail:

• If you are able to include the material directly in the text of your e-mail message, that is preferable.

• If you wish to send us an attachment, please make sure it is an unformatted text file (such as "ASCII," "textonly," etc.) before you attach it to your e-mail.

The reason we prefer not to receive Microsoft Word files is because we often get a lot of formatting gibberish when Microsoft word files come to us, especially across platforms. (We have a MAC.) We use QuarkXpress for our page layout application. When we have tried to import Microsoft Word files sent to us in the past without first opening and resaving them in the Word application, they have most often caused Quark to quit on us.


• Reporters: when you send us your information by email, it is important to include, at the top, the presidents' and reporters' names, addresses and phone numbers, and the contact number to appear in the club news on these pages. Don't try to put them side by side: you can do the presidents first, then your info underneath that, then the contact phone number. 
Be an angel! When was the last time you were an angel? With more than a half a dozen classes going on, you can probably find an op-


portunity to show up and help out. Besides being great for the overall spirit of square dancing, and good for the new dancers, assisting at class is also great exercise, and good


