



CHEF'S CORNER...

Spring is upon us and the gardening and lawn care jobs are also taking up a great deal of our time on the weekends. Here is a really quick pasta dish with a unique seafood sauce that is as delicious as it is easy to make. The dish seems to have been designed for after spring gardening work in its simplicity.

SEAFOOD LINGUINE

12 oz. cooked linguine
1/2 cup olive oil
1/2 cup melted butter
1 large onion, chopped
6 garlic cloves, minced
Rosemary & oregano, to taste
28 oz. can of chopped tomatoes
Salt & pepper, to taste
1 cup dry white wine
1/2 cup parsley, chopped



1 pound medium cooked shrimp, crabmeat, lobster, scallops, imitation crabmeat. Any combination or single seafood ingredient.

Melt butter and combine with oil in skillet; saute onion and garlic until golden. Add wine and cook until evaporated. Reduce heat and add tomatoes, spices, salt & pepper; add the seafood of your choice. Any combination works! Heat for 5 to 7 minutes until heated through. Serve over linguine. Serve with warm Italian or French bread.



These are the people that served on committees and club boards of directors who served so well and made us look good by doing exceptional jobs, whatever it may have been. We have also been rewarded over the years by meet-


ing scores of great people and by the numerous friends we have made. Some of these friendships are fairly new but many

Award.




The Daphne-Norma Leadership Award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvaggio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose is to recognize and honor people who have had an extensive and sustained influence in the square, round and contra dancing community spanning a number of years. The award is annually presented at Dance-O-Rama to

Learning From the Past...Reminiscences of Our Square Dancing Roots...

An interview of the legendary square dance developer, Ed Gilmore, which was conducted in 1961, was recently brought to our attention. Historical Notes...His Background

I was one of the first perhaps to introduce hash, as such. We used it as a device then to simplify square dancing, because when we began, at the time that I started calling, ...the method used was to teach entire dances as memorized routines. These were visiting couple dances. This was about 15 years ago. And this was all over the country. They taught memorized routines. In other words, you learned an entire dance. And you accidentally learned in a routine, Right and Left Thrus and Chains, but it was a part of the routine — the whole dance. And then the caller didn't change that call, he called it exactly the same every time. Same introduction, same figures, and usually four changes of the same figure for each couple in the early dancing; the visiting couple dances.

And the problem arose that, if someone was sick for a couple of weeks or went away for a while and came back, that in the meantime, the caller had taught several new routines, and that person didn't know these routines and found it impossible to dance. So I broke the thing down into basic figures, primary basic figures, in the hope of simplifying it. That they would listen and do one figure at a time. That they would not be required to do any memorizing, and that would put the entire burden of memorizing on the caller's shoulders.

Well, this worked beautifully because they could come and learn Right and Left Thru and Swing, Promenade, and Do-Si-Do, and so forth, and we had about 10 primary figures and about 14 or 15 miscellaneous or secondary figures which were not so frequently used. A total of 24 terms and figures to learn, and then you could do any dance. All you had to do was listen and do one figure at a time, and you could do any dance. If a miscellaneous figure came along in a dance, the caller gave a brief walk through of that miscellaneous figure and then called the dance.

Thoughts on teaching a diverse group:

You must have a group to have a square dance. You can't do it with one couple. All right, then what will I have

if I have a group of people? If I go out and gather up a group to start, in any neighborhood, to start a beginning group, I will have every degree of ability in mental and physical alertness in that group, and every degree of enthusiasm in that group from the least enthusiastic to the most enthusiastic, so it will be a big spread, you see.

I'll have all this in the same group of people. I will have people who will continue but the fella just doesn't much care whether he ever goes back again, but he comes, his wife drags him. And then, I'll have in that same group, the couple that wants to go five nights this week, and they just put everything else aside, even family, and they don't have any other [hobby], they become complete square dance hobbyists.

The emphasis now...(1961)

There is more emphasis being placed on fun, more emphasis on good dancing, from the standpoint of movement to music and rhythm, timing, flow, natural sequence of figures, and less importance on which hands do you grab but how smoothly can you turn, swing, how well do you time, are you ready at the proper time. Do you give the right number of steps to each figure and arrive at your corner at the correct time?

This is the essence of good dancing and graceful carriage, and these are the things that never grow old, because dancing, from the beginning of man's history, has been one of the important ways for him to express emotion. And it is not just physical exercise. And if the emotion to be expressed is competitive feeling, then it is directly opposed to the whole idea of square dancing which is complete cooperation. Now the proof of this is that whenever a set dances a square and it just falls together, everyone is where they are supposed to be at the right time and it flows and it's smooth and there's no stumbling or waiting for anybody, and they finish with the music, in time with the caller, or sometimes even in spite of him, and they finish at the right time, everyone applauds like crazy, and they're applauding themselves because they did the dance.

But, if that same set hassles and has trouble and turmoil and they get snarled up and then get straightened out and dance again, and then tangled again and then straighten out, they don't applaud very much when they finish that square. And it may have been called well, you see, but they didn't know how to dance well. And some of them didn't know how to time properly, because they were too busy learning new terms and new figures which, as a rule, are new names for old figures, confusing names for old figures, they were too busy learning figures, you see, they didn't have time to learn to dance.

Dear Reporters and other interested dancers...

Because we are continuing to receive club news, schedules, and more, at our e-mail address (listed on page 3), here are our suggestions for those wishing to submit material:


- If you are able to include the information directly in the text of your e-mail message, that is preferable. And it is generally easy to do: just copy it (you can find both "copy" and "paste" commands under the edit menu in most applications), and go to the body of the e-mail, and paste it there.
- If you MUST send an attachment, please make sure it is an unformatted text file (such as "ASCII," "text-only," etc.) before you attach it to your e-mail.

The reason we prefer not to receive Microsoft Word files is because we often get a lot of formatting gibber-

ish when Microsoft word files come to us, especially across platforms. (We have a MAC.) We use QuarkXpress for our page layout application. When we have tried to import Microsoft Word files sent to us in the past without first opening and resaving them in the Word application, they have most often caused Quark to quit on us.

• Reporters: when you send us your information by e-mail, it is important to include, at the top, the presidents' and reporters' names, addresses and phone numbers, and the contact number to appear in the club news on these pages. Don't try to put them side by side: you can do the presidents first, then your info underneath that, then the contact phone number. Please don't add tabs, indents, or extra spaces at the beginnings of paragraphs (or anywhere).
