

CHEF'S CORNER...

Here it is almost time for the new dance season to start. It is also time to start thinking about what to make for the snack tables around the Square Dance Community This recipe will more than satisfy all the chocoholics at the clubs. Along with a secret ingredient that will literally Knock Your Socks off.

KNOCK YOU NAKEDS

1 pkg. German chocolate cake mix.

1 cup coarsely chopped nuts (your choice)

1/3 cup evaporated milk.

3/4 cup butter, melted.

60 pcs. caramel candy.

1/2 cup evaporated milk.

1 cup (or more) chocolate chips.

Combine and mix well, cake mix, nuts, 1/3 cup milk, and butter. Press half of the mixture into

the bottom of a greased 8" X 13" Pyrex baking dish; bake at 350°F for 8 minutes. Melt the caramel candies in top of a double boiler with 1/2 cup milk. When caramel mixture is well mixed, pour over baked mixture. Cover with chocolate chips and cover with rest of dough on top of the chips. Bake for 18 minutes at 350°F. Cool completely before cutting into squares. Yields 18 to 20 squares of pure chocolaty decadence.

This-n-That from the Editor's Desk...


Dear Readers,


Federation News...



Learning From the Past...

Reminiscences of Our Square Dancing Roots...

An interview of the legendary square dance devel-

A problem identified...

The fact remains that we have grown so tremendously in the United States in the past 10 years, [1951-61] and especially the last 5 or 6, that thousands of new callers have started with no training, absolutely no training. The majority of them didn't even know how to dance well. They didn't even know how to do figures well when they started calling. And yet they are trying to teach other people to dance, and [they] call for them. And the dancer coming into this sort of an activity is the victim of a circumstance which is no one's fault but, nevertheless, leaves him in the position of square dancing for a short time and dropping out.

And we have had in this country, a year or so ago, spot surveys to determine as near as we could, and it ran around 85% turn-over in two years.

His take on what works...

We've heard it from so many people. So, what we're trying to do is to instigate a training program in every area conducted by the older, more capable, leaders, the ones who have gone through all of these phases. They've tried speed and complexity, and intricate choreography, and novelty, and mob hysteria, and showmanship, and telling jokes, and everything else.

They've tried all these things, and they've come to the conclusion that the only thing that can be sustained year in and year out is good, comfortable, rhythmical movement to music and good sociability, tremendous emphasis on the sociability, the enjoying the company of other people.

Good leaders needed...

First, you have to recognize this, that every activity is just as strong or just as weak as its leadership, and I don't think anyone can argue with that. Therefore, we must develop strong leaders. The leader, and the principal leader in the square dance activity, is the caller. He must be the principal leader. He must develop good dancers and good dance leaders who will lead dancers insofar as leading them through the necessary steps to make a dance function, to make a club function.

Dancing requires music...

I think dancing must be comfortable, flowing, rhythmical, properly timed, no clip timing, properly designed, no two right hands in succession.

The caller has to work at timing, and rhythm, and phrasing, and pitch, and harmony, and, post-command insurance and pre-command insurance, dance design, program design, balance of new and old, all the things that go into making good programming.

He has to work at knowing how to get along with people, how to handle people and it's work, you have to study.

It requires work, and study, and effort. Anybody can get up and just recite words and ignore the music, you see. But it will not be sustained dancing. You see, from the beginning of man's history, ever since the very beginning of man's history, dancing has been to music, and every form of dancing in the history of the world is precisely measured to music.

I have never found anyone, who can phrase and time properly, and use correct design of the dance and knows and understands the music and the relation of the dancing to the music, who disagrees with me.

Nevertheless...

I'm smart enough to know that the average dancer couldn't care less when I've been real clever. When he's happy is when I move him continuously through three hours of dancing without him stumbling and being embarrassed, and he's moved rhythmically, and he's not exhausted and tired, and wants to dance another hour.

I know he'll be back next week.

How about it, folks — what makes you come back next week?
What's your opinion?

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers

to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps lifesaving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second dancer attends him/her.



Emergency Call

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, according to his-

torical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs - please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.
