

CHEF'S CORNER...

Finally we are starting to get into winter-like weather. Here is a great soup to warm you up on those days you spend shoveling snow. Coming in out of the cold and smelling this wonderful aroma starts to warm you up even before dinner is ready.

REVISED FREE* SOUP

1 46 oz. any variety of V-8 juice

1/2 head cabbage, shredded

- 1 pkg frozen Brussels sprouts
- 1 small head cauliflower, cut into bite sized chunks
- 1 lb. broccoli (or more) cut into bite sized chunks. Plus the stalks peeled and sliced
- 1 can 10 oz. diced tomatoes, any variety
- 1 cup celery, diced
- 2 onions, chopped
- 1 can 14.5 oz. green beans
- 1 can peas
- 2 chopped bell peppers
- 4 carrots, sliced OR 1 can sliced carrots
- 4 to 6 cloves Garlic, diced or pressed
- 2 tbs parsley



- 2 tbs oregano
- 1 to 2 pkgs onion soup mix
- 1/4 cup + 2 tbs balsamic
- vinegar
- 2 tsp Worcester sauce
- 1 can 4 oz. mushrooms, optional
- 1 to 2 pkgs beef bouillon, optional
- 1 can sliced potatoes, optional
- 2 bay leaves, remove after soup is finished salt & pepper to taste.

You'll need a HUGE soup pot for this entire recipe (cut down as needed) BUT the soup freezes well and can be stored in the freezer as a quick meal any time. Throw everything in the pot and cover with water, more water means more soup!

Bring to a boil, stirring occasionally, and then simmer for 40 to 60 minutes or until vegetables reach desired tenderness. Adjust seasonings, as needed. Serve with crusty bread.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for The Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTEN-SIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EX-TENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Sally Baechle, Ken & Kay Georger, Bill and Joan Newman, and Ed and Sybil Briggs.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to the Selection Committee, in care of Ed and Sybil Brig-

gs, 8237 Rt. 5 & 20, Bloomfield, NY 14469-9567, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or updated information should be sent. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info.

If you already have health coverage that includes prescriptions, you can use this card to save money when your plan does not cover a particular medication.

Most of the pharmacies in the country are on this program. Included on the extensive list are local pharmacies like Eckerd, K-Mart, Rite Aid, Sam's Club, Target, Tops, Wal-Mart, Wegmans, and so many more that we couldn't list them all here. For a complete list, go to www.findrx2go2.com.

How The SCRIP Discount Program Works

This is what an individual experiences when he uses the card:

• The individual presents his/her card and the original prescription to the pharmacist.

• The pharmacist then accesses the proper screen for the discount program. If the individual has not yet been registered, the pharmacist will then enter necessary identifying information (name, date of birth, social security) to permanently register them as a participant.

• At that point, the prescription information is entered into the pharmacy computer system along with the street price for that drug (street price being what he would charge anyone off the street who walked in).

• The computer compares the submitted pharmacy price with the discounted price*, determines which is lower and sends that price back to the pharmacy to be charged to the individual. This program has a very unique feature of allowing "less of the two," which means if the store "sale price" is lower than the discount price, the individual will get the lowest possible price for that drug, on that day, in that pharmacy.

*When arriving at the discounted price, the program will consider the "maximum allowable cost" of the federal HCFA-MAC and will use that pricing if it is lower than what the contracted discount would have produced.

• There is a pharmacy desk toll-free number available (shown on the member's ID card) to assist both members and pharmacists.

Whether you use **one or a hundred** different pharmacies in this program, your prescription will always be checked for drug interaction with everything you have filled to date. This has become a valuable tool for safeguarding people against this serious problem.

PLEASE NOTE: Timing is just as **important** in Discount Prescription Cards as it is in square dancing. Get the **free USDA** cards out to everyone who needs them **right away**. The government is going to offer senior citizens a discount card very similar to this program by the beginning of 2002. The big difference is it will probably have some drugs omitted and it will cost \$25 per year!

Why would people pay \$25 when they can get a better card from the USDA for free? Because if people do not know about the USDA card, they will gladly buy the government discount card because it represents a great value. All you have to do is get your card to them first!

Square Dance Attire

At this point in lessons, students are often beginning to wonder about square dance attire what they will need, and where they will buy the clothes. Here is some basic information.

Men should wear long-sleeve Western-style shirts and neckwear, and regular or Western pants.

Women should wear a dress or a skirt and blouse, with a petticoat and pettipants. Prairie skirts may also be worn.

Footwear should be comfortable and of a type which will not damage the dance floor.

A badge is an important part of the square dance attire. It promotes friendliness and sociability.

Dancers should be alert to the fact that when they are in square dance attire, non-square dancers often judge all square dancers by the way they act.


Square dance attire is worn to most square dance activities unless indicated otherwise. On our schedules at the back of this publication, the code "CA" means choice of attire (Western or casual), and the lowercase version, "ca," indicates casual attire.


At the National Square Dance Convention (see page 24) appropriate square dance attire is required for entry to the convention hall. Our colorful apparel identifies us as square dancers. So, dress the part and you will look special, feel special, and be special.

It has been theorized that one of the reasons the divorce rate is extremely low among square dancers is the fact that when they dress up, the woman feels like a woman, and the man like a man, and their behavior reflects it. There is a sense of rightness and appropriateness involved. It's just an extra fringe benefit of a healthy, wholesome activity.

I listened to the bugler play and felt a sudden chill. I wondered just how many


times that taps had meant "Amen"


- When a flag had draped a coffin of a brother or a friend.



At the April 12, 2000 Federation meeting, the rules for banner stealing were reviewed. The consensus of the meeting was that there needed to be flexibility in the rules. If a club was not able to muster enough couples to steal and/or retrieve a banner, the target club could agree to fewer couples participating. It was pointed out that the goal of banner stealing is to encourage the clubs to intermingle.

For our readers' convenience, the rules are reprinted here. If there are any questions, please check with the Federation.



1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club. 3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.
