Andy served in the Navy in the Pacific during WWII, and was an engineer for Delco and Eastman Kodak. An avid golfer, he volunteered for many years at the LPGA tournaments. He was Past President of the Genesee Dancers, an accomplished bridge player, and loved his grandsons. He was known and loved by his neighbors and friends for always helping them and being able to fix anything.

He mentioned often how square dancing had brought a real joy to his life and how he had wished that he had found it sooner than he did. He enjoyed his square dancing years at Genesee Dancers so much that he wanted to give something back to it, and he and Nancy did so in many ways and on many occasions.

Here is a delightful recipe for cookie bars that has been tried and found guilty of being amazingly delicious. It is difficult to come up with something new for your dessert tables at your dances. I'm sure you will find these a wonderful new taste sensation with almost a decadent flavor. Thanks to the Nestle website for their many wonderful treats!

## CARAMEL OATMEAL CHEWIES

$1-3 / 4$ cups quick or old-fash-
ioned oats
$1-3 / 4$ cups all-purpose flour,
$\quad$ divided
$3 / 4$ cup packed brown sugar
$1 / 2$ teaspoon baking soda
$1 / 4$ teaspoon salt (optional)
$3 / 4$ cup ( $1-1 / 2$ sticks) butter
or margarine, melted


2 cups (12-oz. pkg.) Nestlé Toll House ${ }^{8}$ Semi-Sweet Chocolate Morsels
1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup caramel ice cream topping

Preheat oven to $350^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. Grease bottom of $13 \times 9$-inch baking pan.
Combine oats, 1-1/2 cups flour, sugar, baking soda and salt in large bowl. Stir in butter; mix well. Reserve 1 cup oat mixture; press remaining oat mixture onto bottom of prepared baking pan.

Bake for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden brown. Sprinkle with morsels and nuts. Mix caramel topping with remaining flour in small bowl; drizzle over nuts to within $1 / 4$ inch of pan edges. Sprinkle with reserved oat mixture.

Bake for 18 to 22 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pan on wire rack; refrigerate until firm.

They were Federation Reps in ' 82 , Membership Chairmen in '83, Social Chairmen again in ' 86 , Secretary in '88, '89, '93, '94, \& '95, and Publicity Chairmen in '96 \& '97. Since 1998, they have been both Social and Publicity chairmen. (Publicity includes doing the job of Promenader Reporter - writing news articles and submitting schedules for each issue.)

Ken \& Kay Georger, pesidents of Country Twirlers, noted: "Bill and Edith encourage members to volunteer for refreshments, make assignments and very often fill in for someone who had signed up and at the last minute can't make the dance. But that's not all!! They are always on hand early to help whenever we have

At least 15 of the 25 clubs must be affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs. A maximum of 10 non-affiliated clubs can be used, including Dance-O-Rama.

The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/ cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club
booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the ticket table.

## Square Dance Attire

The following are guidelines for Western square dance attire:
Men should wear long-sleeve Western-style shirts and neckwear, and regular or Western pants. Women should wear a dress or a skirt and blouse, with a petticoat and pettipants. Prairie skirts may also be worn.

Footwear should be comfortable and of a type which will not damage the dance floor. A badge is an important part of the square dance attire. It promotes friendliness and sociability.

Dancers should be alert to the fact that when they are in square dance attire, non-square dancers often judge all square dancers by the way they act.

Square dance attire is worn to most square dance activities unless indicated otherwise. On our schedules at the back of this publication, the code " CA " means choice of attire (Western or casual), and the lowercase version, "ca," indicates casual attire.

At the National Square Dance Convention (see page 24) appro-
priate square dance attire is required for entry to the convention hall. Our colorful apparel identifies us as squarè dancers. So, dress the part and you will look special, feel special, and be special.

It has been theorized that one of the reasons the divorce rate is extremely low among square dancers is the fact that when they dress up, the woman feels like a woman, and the man like a man, and their behavior reflects it There is a sense of rightness and appropriateness involved. It's just an extra fringe benefit of a healthy, wholesome activity.

New square dance clothing can be purchased through catalogs or at specialty Western wear shops. Although Rochester does not specifically have a square dance shop, our advertiser, Petticoats and Partners, brings their shop to many of our dances, such as D.O.R. in May, and several Cayuga Cut-Ups' events. And they have an excellent website. (See page 26.)

Used clothing can be purchased inexpensively at the Prome nader Used Clothing Sales, and other class-club get-togethers. Also, our classified ads on page 4 often include additional sources.
