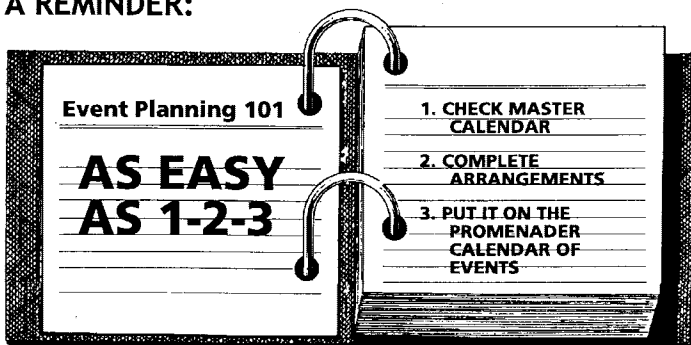

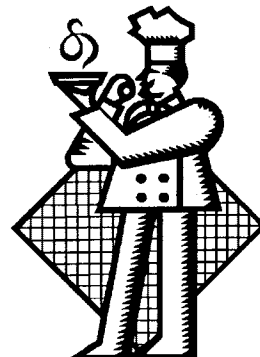
## CHEF'S CORNER...

It is about that time to get out the shoe polish and touch up those dancing shoes. Also it might be a good time to check out the skirts and shirts in case they might need a touch-up with the old steam iron!

As it is the time that many clubs are coming out of their summer hiatus which means we might start thinking about the refreshment tables and what to bring when it is our turn. Here is a recipe that I picked up from the internet that might be what you are looking for.

### **RUSSIAN BALLS**

- 1 cup butter/margarine
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 2 cups walnuts, chopped
- 1/4 cup powdered sugar



Cream butter and sugar. Add in flour and vanilla. Finely chop walnuts and add to batter. Pinch off pieces of dough and roll between hands into small bite-size balls.

Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet in a 350°F. oven for 30 to 40 minutes

Remove from oven. Cool slightly and roll in powdered sugar.

Yield: 48 cookies.

## In Memoriam

### AL PEMBROOK

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the death of Alvin Pembrook on August 3, 2002.

A long-time dancer, Al and his wife joined the Irondequoit Square Dance Club. Following his wife's death, Al joined the Cloverleaf Squares, where he danced for many years and at one time served as its treasurer. Here he met and partnered with Arlene Driscoll, who became his lifelong best friend.

Eventually the pair joined Silver Squares where they became regular dancers and participants in all of the club's activities. Al was known for his friendliness and fun-loving kidding. He was especially fond of Yellow Rocking all the ladies, while displaying a big grin and a mischievous twinkle in his eyes.

Al loved living life to its utmost. In addition to dancing, he liked bowling, horseshoes and euchre tournaments. Most impressive was the faith with which he lived and died. Just as he faced every situation in his life here without a quarrel or complaint, he faced eternity peacefully and gratefully.

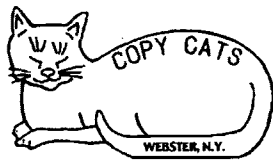
## Copy Cats

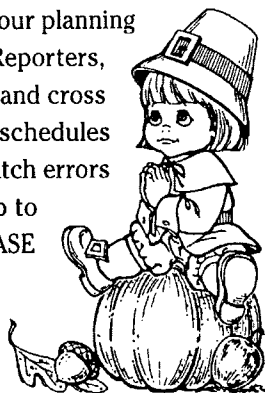


## A MESSAGE TO ALL WHO SEND IN INFORMATION:

### Symbol Clarification

A question has arisen lately in regard to what starting time to list on these schedules. At the September 9 Federation meeting, the question was resolved with the following: All starting times will be the actual time that dancing of any kind starts. Thus, if the squares start at 8:00, and are preceded by a half-hour of

rounds, the listed starting time will be 7:30. The symbol "H" has been redefined to mean: half-hour of rounds **at start of dance**.

Additionally, the "ca" (casual attire) code was eliminated. It was agreed that "CA" (choice of attire) includes both casual and Western attire.

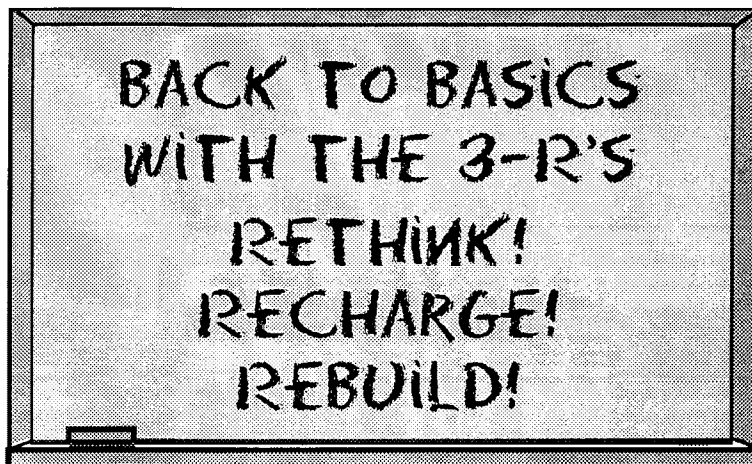
