



CHEF'S CORNER...

I guess we are just about back on an even keel after the celebration and excitement of the holidays. I trust that everyone had a very Merry Christmas and a happy start to this New Year. I think it is about time for some comfort food after all the snack foods and various beverages. This is a crock pot recipe that takes the pain out of post holiday cooking, "Let the Pot do the cooking." The recipe is an offshoot of the Slavic food which is warming and fulfilling.

CROCKPOT SWEEDISH CABBAGE ROLLS

12 large cabbage leaves

1 pound lean ground beef

1 beaten egg

1 cup cooked rice

1/4 cup milk

8 oz. tomato sauce

1/4 cup onions, finely chopped

- 1 teaspoon brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1-1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice.

Immerse cabbage leaves in large kettle of boiling water for about 3 minutes or until limp, drain. Combine egg, milk, onion, salt, pepper, beef and cooked rice; mix well. Place aboout 1/4 cup meat mixture in the center of each leaf. Fold in sides and roll ends over the meat, secure with toothpicks. Place in a crockppot. Combine tomato sauce with brown sugar, lemon juice and Worcestershire sauce. Mix well and pour over the cabbage rolls. Cover and cook on low for 7 to 9 hours.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader, Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Sally Baechle, and Bill and Joan Newman, Ed & Sybil Briggs, and Don and Marion Ellinwood.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications

to the Selection Committee, in care of Bill and Joan Newman, 55 Snell Road, Geneva, NY 14456, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or updated information should be sent. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info.

In Memoriam - Elsie Epke

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the death of Elsie Epke on December 13, 2002, at age 83. She is survived by two daughters and one son, several grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Elsie loved her dancing. She danced with the Glass Slippers from its inception in 1974 till it folded in September 1990. She served in many capacities, including several years as president. Later she was an active member of the Promenading Bees until they folded. She organized an all-ladies square to dance.

Since then she did some dancing but had to curtail her activities because of knee problems.

She often took on tasks so others could enjoy dancing. Elsie was Dance-O-Rama chairman in 1987 & 1991, and headed the DOR committee in 1988, 1990, and 1992, and arranged the DOR dinners in Brockport two other years. She was presented the Daphne-Norma award in 1992. Over the years, Elsie also worked with the *Promenader* editor, and prepared the front cover of this publication many times.

She was very active at the Sweden Senior Center, Retired Teachers Association and the Sweden Democrats. Among her many awards were Senior Citizen of the Year presented in 1983 by the Genesee Conference of Senior Citizens Directors. In 1992 she was presented the Community Service Award by the Brockport-Sweden-Clarkson Joint Recreation Committee. Elsie Epke was recently presented the Teacher of the Month award by Channel 8.

She became a line dance instructor and taught in Spencerport, Brockport, Batavia and Churchville. She and her group entertained in many Senior Citizens Centers, Nursing Homes and pretty much wherever they were invited.

Elsie was a person who could not say anything negative about anyone; she would always comment positively about a person. One would have to write a book to tell all that Elsie was involved in — she never said no when asked to do something.

Now she can relax and no longer be uncomfortable with her health ailments. Many of us hope to see her again and in the meantime we all will just say: See you later, Elsie.



Letters and petitions were provided. The Rochester Area Federation should have close to 800 signatures on the petitions to the four legislators asking them to co-sponsor the bill.

We are reporting this to UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA campaign chairpersons. We have also sent in articles to the *Democrat*, suburban papers and community news for three counties. Please look for these articles.

We are excited about this campaign and hope to use it this year as a means for publicity and square dance awareness!

New dancers are part of our square dancing; they are not outsiders.


New dancers are human beings with feelings; they deserve to be treated with respect.
