CHEF'S CORNER...

With the summer upon us and with the temperature climbing, I think we might be ready to use a slow cooker so that the kitchen would not be overheated and the BBQ chefs would not be roasting themselves in the garage or on the patio in the hot sun. Here is a tasty recipe for a hearty chicken dish without any of the excess heat.

CHEATERS CHICKEN CACCIATORE

- 6 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
- 1 (28 0z.) jar spaghetti sauce
- 2 green bell peppers, seeded and cubed
- 8 oz. fresh mushrooms, sliced
- 1 onion, finely diced
- 2 tablespoons minced garlic



Put the chicken in the slow cooker. Top with the sauce, peppers, mushrooms, onion and garlic. Cook on low for 7 to 9 hours. Serve with crusty French or Italian bread.

NOTE: You might consider preparing the ingredients the evening before and placing in separate zip-lock baggies. Refrigerate until the following morning, then place all the ingredients as above, plug in the cooker, set at low and turn it on. Go to work or do your usual daily chores, knowing that dinner will be ready when everyone comes home.

If you have a recipe that has been especially enjoyed by a lot of folks, please feel free to share it with others on these pages. Here is one that we received from Kay Georger:

ZUCCHINI BETTY

4 cups flour
3 cups sugar

3 cups sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt 3 sticks margarine 8 cups zucchini, peeled, seeded and cut into 1/2-inch cubes

2/3 cup bottled lemon juice 1/1/2 teaspoons cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon nutmeg

Mix flour, 1 cup of sugar and salt. Cut in margarine until crumbly. Pat half of this mixture in a 13x9-inch pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes.

Cook zucchini in lemon juice until tender. Add 2 cups sugar, 1 teaspoon cinnamon and nutmeg. Simmer 4 minutes. Add 1/2 cup of the flour mixture and stir to thicken. Cool slightly.

Pour filling onto the crust. Add 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon to the remainder of the flour mixture. Sprinkle over the filling. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes.

Presidents' Corner...

Dear Dancing Friends,

As we all know the number of clubs and square dancers continues to decline each year, not only here but across the country. It is baffling to many of us since we know the benefits that square dancing offers. Unfortunately, we have not been sensitive to the need of younger people who will be succeeding us and we have not generated enough enthusiasm for them to become part of the square dance community. No one is really certain of what we should do to reverse this trend and help build strong growing square dance clubs once again. One thing though that is certain — if we do nothing, nothing will change and square dancing will continue to decline.

As your Federation, we have decided that we cannot simply stand by and hope that the situation will change. We MUST TAKE ACTION AND BECOME CHANGE AGENTS. The first step we have taken was to add a committee on "Promotion and Development." This committee, with input from practitioners in advertising and marketing as well as other fields, has presented proposals to help attract new dancers. By this time we will have contacted each club president with our plan. In a "nutshell" this is what we plan:

- 1. The Federation will provide leadership, including professional, tri-fold brochures, business cards, and training to all clubs for help in recruiting new dancers.
- 2. Portray a new image in dress, organization and program which appeals to the younger, sophisticated generation that will succeed us.
- 3. Introduce multi-cycle and compact new dancer programs so we may recruit and offer dancing classes all year long.
- 4. Promote square dancing through:
- (a) our new website www.squaredancinginrochester.org
- (b) Advertising in newspapers and radio
- (c) Free dance lessons and parties
- (d) Demos and Benefit Dances targeted at groups with potential dancers.
- 5. Improve and better coordinate recruitment of new dancers by having a central phone number (585) 227-7122 for interested people to call.

This is an ambitious plan and will need the support of all clubs and dancers in order to succeed. Let's all do our best to keep "squares" dancing!

In Memoriam - Lottie Schiemann

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area square dance community in mourning the loss of Lottie Schiemann on May 18, 2003, at the age of 88.

Lottie was a lover of music and dancing all of her life. As a young rural girl, she joined her family and friends at dances held regularly in local Grange halls. As was common for many farm country residents, this was her introduction to square dancing.

Lottie married and took up residence in Irondequoit, but was widowed at age 59. Wanting to combine her love of dancing with a renewed social life, she joined a group of seniors at Summerville Presbyterian Church, where Mike Callahan was teaching Western Square Dancing.

Eventually Lottie joined Silver Squares at the Greece Community Center and continued with them until she suffered a disabling stroke in 1999. Her remaining years were spent in a nursing home until her recent death. Her niece, Laraine Frolich, says her biggest disappointment was having to give up dancing.

In Memoriam - George Shaw

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the death of George Shaw on June 8, 2003, at age 90. He was born in Jefferson City, MO. He was predeceased by his wife, Una, and survived by three sons, 10 grandchildren, and 11 great-grandchildren.

When George was two years old, his father, who was from Scotland, died while serving in the British Army in World War I. George's mother was forced to put him and his two older brothers in an orphanage, and in foster care until she could secure employment in Rochester and regain custody.

George worked as a radio repairman, auto mechanic, meat cutter and truck driver before holding several positions at RG&E over a 33-year period. He and his wife, Una, were married for 59 years.

George was a volunteer fireman for the Riverdale Fire Dept. in Chili, a member of the Oatka Masonic Lodge in Scottsville (becoming a 32nd degree Mason), and a member of the Scottish Rite, the Rochester Scottish Heritage Society, and the Clan Shaw Society. George enjoyed playing bagpipes. He was a member of the White Johnston Memorial Pipe Band for several years, and a lifetime member of the Rochester Scottish Pipe Band, Inc.

George and Una were avid dancers, enjoying both round and square dancing. Over the years, they were members of several square dance clubs. They chaired the local area benefit square dance for Muscular Dystrophy, raising in excess of \$17,000 over a 10-year period.

A member of Silver Squares in recent years, George enjoyed square dancing with partner Sally Foos, and participating in dinners, tour bus trips, and more.

During his final days, George said that he had a great life and a wonderful family.

In Memoriam - Dick Wickman

The square dance community wishes to note the passing of Dick Wickman on June 27, 2003. He is survived by his wife of 44 years, Ida Dee, three children and five grandchildren.

Dick and Dee met at a square dance in the spring of 1956. A nursing student from Syracuse, she was completing course requirements in Rochester for which there had been no openings in Syracuse. He was a member of the Foot-n-Fiddle square dance club.

Correspondence and visits between Rochester and Syracuse led to their marriage in 1958, and they even went to a square dance camp for part of their honeymoon!

Dick's other interests included the Bridge Club at Kodak since before he & Dee were married, and continuing through his retirement years; spending time gardening in his garden & greenhouse, and as a Master Gardener in the Cooperative Ext. program; and especially, hiking the Appalachian Trail – he hiked the entire 2,000 miles from Maine to Georgia in 2 to 4-week segments over 13 years.

In 1962-63, Dick and Dee took lessons with the Eck-O-Squares, then had their third child, and didn't resume square dancing until 1989, after their children were grown and on their own. They joined the Copy Cats in 1990, and later the Circul-8-tors, and the Southern Tier Wheelers. Dick and Dee were active members and also officers of the Copy Cats for many years, and were dedicated Angels for their new class members. Dick made a great corner and he loved to swing!

We hope everyone will enjoy the rest of the summer, while gearing up for a great year of square dancing!



COLORADO TRAVEL SPOTLIGHT

In this series of articles we will spotlight little known unique Colorado attractions that you can visit while in Colorado.

Kit Carson County Carousel

The Kit Carson County Carousel is a National Historic Landmark, owing to its status as the oldest, virtually unaltered, carousel built by the Philadelphia Toboggan Co. in 1905. It's one of only 160 wooden carousels operating in North America, and it's accompaniment, an ornate 1912 Wurlitzer Monster Military Band Organ, is believed to be the only one of its kind still operating.

The Kit Carson County Carousel has had a strange odyssey. It was built for the Denver amusement park Elitch Gardens. The wooden lions, tigers, armored horses, donkeys, deer, camels, goats, giraffes and a dog did their counterclockwise summer march there until the carousel was sold in 1928, along with the band organ, to Kit Carson County for \$1,200. The county commissioners bought the carousel for the fairgrounds. The carousel was shut down in 1931, when the Depression forced suspension of the county fair. The carousel and its animals remained entombed in their building until the fair resumed in 1937. Corn and feed had been stored in the building with the carousel, and it had become home to mice, pigeons and snakes. The carousel was cleaned and made operational, but the real resurrection began as a bicentennial project, and the restoration spanned 25 years. The hand-carved relic is now a historic treasure; it is the only antique carousel in America that still has the original paint on the scenery and on the animals. The deer have real antlers and some of the horses have real horsetails. The fully restored 1912 Wurlitzer Monster Military Band Organ plays while the carousel goes around. It, and the drive machinery, are enclosed in the center of the carousel by 45 Victorian oil paintings.

This Historic Carousel is located in Burlington, CO. Burlington is located off I-70 in eastern Colorado, just west of the Kansas state line. The carousel operates-from 1:00-8:00 p.m. from Memorial Day to Labor Day. For 25 cents you will get a tour and a ride.






