CHEF'S CORNER...

This recipe is taken from a book of mine entitled "The Thirty Minute Cookbook." I have chosen this delicious recipe for two reasons. One: the taste and aroma while cooking; and two: it's a good hearty soup for these cold days and nights.

ITALIAN VEGETABLE SOUP

- 1 pound bulk Italian sausage
- 1 medium union, sliced
- 1 can (15oz.) garbanzo beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 can (14-1/2 oz) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 can (14-1/2 oz) beef broth
- 1-1/2 cups water
 - 2 medium zucchini cut into 1/4 inch slices
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil

Grated Parmesan cheese

In a 3 quart saucepan, brown sausage and onions, drain...Stir in beans, tomatoes, broth, water, zucchini, and basil; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 5 minutes or until the zucchini is tender.

YEILD: 6 to 8 servings (2 quarts)

Sprinkle each serving with cheese.


READER'S RECIPES...

Pumpkin Dump Cake

1 can (29-oz.) pumpkin	1/2 teaspoon ground ginger	
3 eggs	1/4 teaspoon cloves	
1/2 cup brown sugar	one package yellow cake	
1/2 cup white sugar	mix or spice cake mix	
one 12-oz. can evaporated milk	1/2 cup chopped pecans	
1 teaspoon cinnamon	1/2 cup melted butter or margarine	

Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease a 9" x 13" pan. In a bowl mix everything except last 3 ingredients. Pour into pan. Sprinkle dry cake mix over top of pumpkin, and then sprinkle pecans over mix. Drizzle butter all over the nut/mix. Bake for 50-60 minutes, the edges will be light brown. Good warm or cold with whipped cream.

Dancing Has Been Found To Reduce Alzheimer's Risk

Prevention has reported that when it comes to lowering your risk of dementia, including Alzheimer's disease, it pays to keep your mind active. Now a new study finds that getting out on the dance floor can help too. Researchers tracked 469 people, ages 75 to 85, for 5 years. "People who danced four or more times a week had a 76 percent lower dementia risk than people who said they rarely or never danced," said Joe Verghese, M.D., assistant professor of neurology at Albert Einstein College of Medicine. In fact, of all the physical activities that Verghese looked at, dancing was the only one associated with a significantly lower dementia risk. Why? "Dancing involves both mental and physical effort," says Verghese. After all, you have to move your body and memorize steps to glide smoothly around a dance floor.

THE DAPHNE-NORMA LEADERSHIP AWARD

Your assistance is needed in selecting a person or couple for the Daphne-Norma Leadership Award, which is presented at Dance-O-Rama. The Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs, Inc., although it sponsors Dance-O-Rama, does not govern, sponsor or present the Daphne-Norma Award. It is governed by and presented by the award's Selection Committee. The committee needs you to nominate people you feel meet the criteria for the Award.

Award Guidelines

The leadership award was established in 1977 by John Fink and Frank Salvagio in honor of their wives, Daphne and Norma. The purpose of the award is to show appreciation for EXTENSIVE

AND SUSTAINED LEADERSHIP OVER AN EXTENDED PERIOD OF YEARS in square, round or contra dancing. Leadership, service and motivation are considered when evaluating candidates for this award. A candidate need not demonstrate leadership in all areas, nor is each area given equal consideration. Areas of leadership may include (but are not limited to) years of dancing, cueing or calling; membership; committee service or officer role in any of the following: Square, Round or Contra club; Rochester Area Federation; Promenader; Dance-O-Rama; NYS Association or National Associations; promoting the activity through calling, cueing or teaching, and other leadership roles which benefit the community through the dance activity; and finally, the candidate's attitude and continuing willingness to take on responsibilities in the dancing community. An individual or couple may win the award only once. The award may not be given if the Selection Committee unanimously agrees no one met the criteria. Anyone in the dancing community is welcome to nominate people for the Leadership Award.

Questions You Might Have

Q: Who is the Selection Committee? The award originators are permanent Selection committee members. But because the Salvagios are not active in the dance community anymore, Frank asked Walt and Sally Baechle to be permanent members on the committee. (Walt passed away on Oct. 3, 2000.)

The most recent three recipients form the remainder of the committee. So currently, the members are John & Daphne Fink, Sally Baechle, and Ed & Sybil Briggs, Don and Marion Ellinwood, and Gary and Alice Bubel.

Q: How do people get nominated? Anyone in the dance community can nominate a candidate. This is done by sending information about the candidate's qualifications to

the Selection Committee, in care of Gary and Alice Bubel, 7767 Walker Rd., LeRoy, NY 14482, by the end of February.

Q: What is the status of people previously nominated, but not selected? Candidates previously nominated generally stay in consideration for all future years. However, new or updated information should be sent. There is nothing wrong with sending in another nomination with current info.

In Memoriam – Joyce Reeves

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the death of Joyce Reeves on Nov. 25, 2003. She had battled cancer for more than 20 years.

A Cayuga Cut-Up since 1900, Joyce was a very dedicated square dancer. If there was a committee she could be on, she was on it. She and her late husband, Larry, were officers many times, including treasurers and presidents. Joyce would spend hours making decorations for the Summer Weekends at Wells College, and she chaired a New Year's Eve party and dance more than once. Joyce was easy to love and to work with.

Though Joyce used a wheelchair, she attended the summer weekend twice with the help of her friend, Bert, and even had matching dresses for her daughters, Darlene and Wendy, made for the weekend when her friend, Gloria Roth from Nova Scotia was the caller.

Even when in the last few years when she was hard-

ly able, she would be out shopping for the individual gifts for the residents at the nursing home. She always wanted to see a smile on their faces when they received the individual gifts. Participating in the square dancing at the nursing home's Christmas party, she even pushed her resident friend's wheelchair while in her own!

Dancers Fill Christmas Stockings for Soldiers in Iraq

When Elaine Jezsik, a member of Cloverleaf Squares, saw a television report about a few women who made Christmas stockings to send to troops, that inspired her to try a similar project with her square dancing friends.

Cloverleaf's caller, Mike Callahan, has a son named Shawn who is serving with the armed forces in Iraq. (See the Dec./Jan. issue of the *Promenader* for an e-mail from Shawn.)

"I went out and bought six stockings and a few items like playing cards, crossword/find-a-word books, candy, nuts, etc., and presented the idea to our club at our dance," Elaine said.

"I suggested people could either fill a stocking, donate an item, make a monetary donation which I would use to purchase items, or even bake some cookies, which I was sure the soldiers would appreciate. Before I left that Sunday evening, I had donations amounting to over \$70."

The next week, Elaine said, arriving dancers carried items for stockings: "All kinds of things, like toothpaste, tooth brushes, razors, goodies, card games, nuts."

That night, Elaine left with more than \$220 in cash donations from her Cloverleaf friends and some members of the Shamrock Squares, who had heard of the project. With that much money to spend on presents for troops, Elaine got busy:

"I shopped the dollar stores looking to stretch the cash, found hand-held games at K-mart and KB Toys," she said. "We contacted World Wide News and they donated some magazines for the troops. A friend of mine heard about the project and gave me a check for \$50."

Having collected more than \$450, Elaine and her friends were able to stuff 25 stockings with everything from homemade cookies to laundry detergent.

An E-Mail Response From Shawn

Elaine,

Believe it or not, the last two boxes (2 and 3) arrived yesterday. I think all of the guys are really going to be happy when they wake up to find a bulging stocking next to their cot. Thank you also for the decorations. We have put them up, and for a war zone, this place is downright festive. I have taken some pictures with the camera and will send it as soon as I get a few pics of some smiling faces on Christmas. Thank you also for the cookies. Let me tell you that I passed a couple of shoeboxes of them around already, and now people are knocking on my door constantly to try and get more! I am slowly giving them away and we'll save the rest for a Christmas Eve spread so that we can all celebrate together.

I apologize for not writing in the past 10 or so days. We have been very busy with current combat operations. Even though Saddam is caught, there are a lot of people out there that don't believe it is him. There are also those that would make one last stand for the former regime. Unfortunately, much of the old regime is located right here in the heart of Fallujah.

You may have heard on the news that our Brigade was extended another 45 days from the original plan of six months. This is certainly not the best Christmas present that we could have received, but all of your effort and hard work has helped to give us some smiling faces on Christmas. We are all proud to be defending our country for the cause of freedom and look forward to seeing all of our families at home in about 3-4 months. Until then, we have some Christmas stockings to open and cookies to eat from some very generous people back in the states. Thank you once again, and I'll let you know how Christmas turns out for the guys and gals here.

"We even included a few decorations they could put up to make their holiday away from home and loved ones a bit festive," Elaine said, adding that her granddaughter recruited some kids and a few of her school friends to write letters to include in the soldiers' packages.

"In the end, we shipped eight large cartons," Elaine said.


Doughnut Dance Texas Style






ter than anybody!

Hope when you read this that all of you will have had a Healthy, Happy New Year. That's the plan here



KEYNOTE SNEAKER - TIM CRAWFORD


