



The **Silver Club** is

a way of recognizing dancers who have danced to 25 callers/cuers at club dances. A minimum of 15 of the 25 dances at which the dancers get signatures MUST be sponsored by clubs affiliated with the Rochester Area Federation of Round and Square Dance Clubs.


The same caller or cuer may be used more than once, as long as they are calling/cueing at a different club.

When the required number of signatures are collected in a Silver Club booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.

Silver Club booklets will be available at D.O.R. Just ask at the ticket table.



In Memoriam - Ellie Post

Gene was a member of Belles 'n' Beaus for many years and introduced Ellie to square dancing. They were active in Belles 'n' Beaus until a few years ago.

Ellie's sister and brother-in-law, Joyce and Tom Plunkett, are also members of Belles 'n' Beaus.

In Memoriam – Dick Rinehart

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the death of Dick Rinehart on January 12, 2004, at the age of 77. He is survived by his wife Mary, their son and six daughters, and fifteen grand children.

Dick and Mary became members of Village Squares in 1990 and remained active dancers in the club through 2003.

Dick began his career as a civil engineer, but switched his interest to education, obtaining an educational doctorate from Michigan State University. He was the first president of Bay de Noc Community College at Escanaba on Michigan's upper peninsula. Dick was Director of Community College Relations at R.I.T. until his retirement in 1988.

Dick's hobbies included golf and bridge. With a camp on Canandaigua Lake, he was also an avid boater.

Iowa Dancer 100 Years Old

Cecile Ligouri was born September 11.1903. Her father was a farmer and a popular caller at local barn dances. Cecile remembers playing on the floor as her father called. In 1921 Cecile graduated from high school and came in second in the Miss Sac County Beauty Contest, her older sister won!

At age 74, she took lessons from Don Findley. She was a charter member of Tornado Twirlers and helped organize the Pioneers, in 1979.

An accomplished seamstress, she has made nearly 100 outfits. You can rely on her to be specially dressed. Other interests include singing duets with her sister, basketball, ballroom, tap and roller skate dancing, bowling, golf, fishing, and various crafts. She was secretary to the Sac County Superintendent of Schools, operated a roller skating rink and retired as Des Moines Municipal Court Chief Deputy. She has one son. Charles, and three grandchildren.

On October 5, we celebrated Cecile's 100th birthday with a special dance. Cecile can sew up a storm, is interested in a wide variety of people and activities, dances weekly, even with physical ailments and still has plenty of spunk and the friendliness to care for others. If you carry on her legacy and influence many dancers, then her spirit will always be with us!






On TV with Darren Mark

Square Dancers Demo at Heart Dance


On Feb. 20, three squares of dancers plus several additional couples turned out to provide a sample of square dancing fun for the large gathering at the Party House on Beahan Road.

1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club. **3**) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.

WHY GO TO A NATIONAL? Some people might ask, "Why would you go to a National Square Dance Convention®?" After all, the floors aren't very good or comfortable, the crowds are something else (not bad if you like to "bumpsa-daisy"), the sound isn't so very good in the really large dance areas, it can be tiring (surely age has nothing to do with this), and it could cost you a bundle. After being dancers for about 50 years we finally went to the 52nd National Square Dance Convention® in Oklahoma City, and maybe we have some answers now.

Our primary motivation was because we are on a Committee for the 53rd NSDC®, we needed to see how the function was handled in Oklahoma and we were needed to help prepare some NSDC items for shipping to Denver for the 53rd. However, the whole experience was good and revealing.

There were almost 7,800 attendees from all states of the US and several foreign countries. Of course dancing is the primary agenda - squares at 4 levels, rounds at 5 levels, clogging, contra, and western. There were 3 halls that would hold 200 or more squares each and 7 or 8 halls of varying sizes for various types of dancing. Each morning in the large arena there is a "Showcase of Rounds" for an hour and a half; one after another round dance couples (leaders) dance rounds they will teach in various locations later in the day. It is most enjoyable to sit back and watch these people perform all levels of dances and pick out the ones you might enjoy learning. Each afternoon in the large arena you can have a comfortable seat (read, "rest your feet/body") and watch one exhibition dance group after another perform a wide variety of dances that may include clogging, beautiful costumes, intricate figures that are fun to see from a higher vantage point, aerial moves done in the tradition of the Cheyenne Mountain Dancers years ago, very sedate and precision groups, and high-energy groups composed of the more youthful.

Dancing is available almost all day long with the main dances running from 7:00-10:00pm, and if you haven't had enough you can pick an after party (just more dancing in this case) that will last 'til midnight. Some halls offer square dancing only, some rounds only and others have squares with rounds. There are no breaks; when you get tired you just have to bow out of your square and find a seat. The arena was used for mainstream squares with live music each night.

During the day you can attend seminars on various aspects of our activity, what the future may hold, how to recruit dancers or improve your club, sewing seminars, dancing seminars, and caller seminars. There are panel discussions on a variety of interesting subjects, and you might enjoy taking in a fashion show during a rest time. The fairer sex generally want to spend some time in the Vendor Area, about 70 different booths with all kinds of dance-related apparel and accessories, as well as records? and sound systems. The men are sure to find some things of interest too. In your spare time you can browse the Showcase of Publications and the Showcase of Ideas. This will acquaint you with the large variety of publications related to our activity, and give you an idea of the things dancers/clubs are doing in various councils around the country.

A variety of local and state tours are available before, during and after the Convention for those who want to take advantage of being in an unfamiliar area of the country. You must fit in some time for eating and rest.

What we think we learned is that a Convention 1) joins us as a family with common interests, 2) educates, excites and encourages us as participants in a wonderful activity that is larger than most of us realize (even in a time of decline), 3) is a time of meeting and enjoying people we may never see again, 4) is an opportunity to give back a little to this activity that is a part of our heritage and a great personal benefit to us socially and health-wise. Don't go just for the dance; it is so much more. It was inspiring to see, at one of the evening ceremonies, an elderly gentleman in a wheelchair who has attended all 52 National Square Dance Conventions[®]. Looking forward to the 53rd NSDC[®], "Rocky Mountain Roundup".




Reporters, and Readers, A Reminder:



CLUB OFFICERS... If you schedule a national caller or major event opposite another club's already planned major event, you both lose! Please follow these steps when planning events:

Have you ever been on a committee or board that was trying to decide on the date for a big dance? You probably want to plan your event on a date on which another club does not already have a big dance scheduled. Otherwise, you risk having less dancers available to attend yours.

Here is what you need to do:

1. As soon as you have an idea of when you might want to have the event, and **before you**

sign the contract with a national caller, or make any other commitments, CALL THE MASTER CALENDAR CHAIRMAN (Ken Georger, 585-247-7259).



2. If the date is available on the Master Calendar, proceed to **MAKE YOUR ARRANGEMENTS**, and notify Ken immediately that it is all set.

3. SEND THE INFORMATION ON YOUR EVENT TO THE PROMENADER for publication in the next issue on our **Calendar of Events**. The charge is only \$5, and the listing stays in until it happens! And the sooner everyone in our square dancing community knows about

your event, the better your chances of success! So make it a point to list the event as soon as the arrangements are complete. Forms available by mail/e-mail.
