READER'S RECIPES...

If you have a recipe that has been especially enjoyed by a lot of folks, please feel free to share it with others on these pages. Here are two that have been shared with us. The Sour Cream Apple Coffee Cake is from Alice Thompson, and the Cream Puff Cake is from Lou Stevens.

SOUR CREAM APPLE COFFEE CAKE

Cream:

1 c. sugar

1/2 c. margarine

Add & beat: 2 eggs

1 t. vanilla

Add: 1 c. sour cream

1 t. baking powder

1 t. baking soda

2 c. flour

Butter & flour or spray with cooking spray a 9X12 or Bundt pan. Pour half of the batter in the pan. Sprinkle 1/4 of Topping over the batter.

Topping:

1/2 c. sugar

2 t. cinnamon

1/2 c. walnuts

Sprinkle 1 diced apple over the topping. Sprinkle 1/2 of the topping you have left over the apple. Layer the rest of the batter. Sprinkle the remaining topping over all. Bake 20-25 minutes for 9X12 pan or 45 minutes for a Bundt pan at 350°F.

CREAM PUFF CAKE

Like a giant eclair. Filled with creamy cream cheese cream filling, and drizzled with chocolate syrup. *Makes 1*

9x13 inch pan (24 servings).

1 cup water

1/2 cup butter

1 cup all-purpose flour

4 eggs

1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese

4 cups milk

3 (3.5-ounce) packages instant vanilla pudding mix

1 (12-ounce) container frozen whipped topping, thawed

1/4 cup chocolate syrup

1. Preheat oven to 400°F.

2. In a large heavy saucepan, heat butter and water to boiling over medium-high heat. Add flour and reduce heat to low. Cook and stir until it forms a ball and pulls away from the pan. Remove from heat and transfer to a large bowl. Beat in eggs, one at a time, beating well after each egg.

3. Spread in bottom and up the sides of an ungreased 9x13 inch pan. Bake at 400°F for 35 minutes. Cool completely.

4. To make the filling: In a large bowl, combine cream cheese and milk and beat until smooth. Add pudding mix and beat until thickened. Spread over cooled shell. Top with whipped topping, and drizzle chocolate syrup over the top.

Promotion Team Efforts Paying Off; Everyone's Efforts Still Needed

The Promotion and Development Team of the Rochester Area Federation is pleased to welcome new members Bob and Lou Stevens and Mike Callahan. With these additions to our dynamite team we further strengthen our ties to the Federation and the Callers Co-op of Rochester.

Sales of polo shirts with our original trademark logo are selling well. Already, shirt sales have generated over \$1,200 profit to the Federation, which will be used for promotional purposes. The Team is exploring shirt sales to National Singles' Conventions and other federations, which would generate additional income. We are also exploring sales of jackets with the logo.

Local charities have auctioned off four square dance parties, three of which have been hosted by Tecumseh Squares and Copy Cats. Bob Ellis, Gary and Alice Bubel, and Ron Brown had both party guests and club members on the floor enjoying themselves at each of these parties. We learned a few things from this first effort such as the need to eliminate club announcements during parties and making sure guests win a majority of the 50/50 tickets pulled. On June 12, Ron Brown was the caller for a party that drew guests ranging in age from 16 to 60. The young people brought a lot of life to this party and confirmed again the idea that square dancing appeals to both youth and adults.

In addition to exposing people to square dancing through auctioning off parties, the Team has assisted in setting up square dances for nonprofit organizations seeking a fun activity at one of their regularly scheduled events. On May 23, Lollypop Farm included square dancing in their Patron Appreciation Night. And on May 21, the Town of Williamson invited the whole community to a square dance. The Team is in the process of sending letters to numbers of nonprofits asking them to also consider including square dancing at their annual events and fundraisers.

In April the Team secured good coverage of square dancing in *Messenger Post* newspapers and on the Channel 13 "Darren Mark" show. This fall, the team will be using personal and classified ads to publicize square dance classes. Classes will also be listed in community calendars and publications to specific targeted audiences.

So your Promotion Team is working hard, but we need your help!

Full color brochures and business cards are available to all current square dancers to recruit potential dancers and distribute to businesses. The Team is asking every current square dancer to use the materials to contact at least one potential dancer prior to the beginning of fall classes. If brochures have not been made available to you,

With all of us pulling together, square dancing's future in the greater Rochester region can't help but be bright.



It was a humid 87° under overcast skies. While progressing along Titus Avenue for 40 minutes, including uphill and downhill slopes, the two-plus squares of dancers quickly adapted modifications to their normal dancing style as Bob Meagher called. Making changes like doing half of the grand right and left, and frequently moving sideways and wheeling around, they found out that compounding angles caused by progressing forward as a square while dancing can almost triple the distance traveled. A pedometer clocked the 1-1/2 mile route at 3-3/4 miles. In spite of the difficulties, the dancers had a great time, and the parade watchers were reminded by this demo that square dancing is active in our community!


Auburn, NY, were also "enlisted" to add to the


merriment.

So if you missed this "biggie," do not despair; in September you can redeem yourself at the Geneva Friendship Squares Harvest Moon Weekend at Watkins Glen,



right hands, she was exuberantly whispering: "This is really fun!" — and it was!




Why would anyone choose to vegetate and waste away, or even work out at a spa, when you can add 10 to 15 fun years to your life with dancing!!!


At least now I can report: One, you never



dance "expertise" was secondary — this is after all part of their official PE program!


