

#### CAMPAIGN FOR NATIONAL FOLK DANCE UPDATE

REMEMBER THOSE PETITIONS we signed two years ago urging our congresspeople to cosponsor H.R. Bill 645 designating Square Dance as the National Folk Dance for the U.S.? At the time, the bill had been reintroduced to the 108th Congress and co-sponsored by one representative from Kentucky. We mailed our petitions in by mid-January 2003 and as a result articles appeared in the Community News and Messenger Post. In addition Time Warner came to DOR 2003 and taped square dancers for TV. In her response to our peti-

tions, Louise Slaughter wrote us in Sept. 2003 that she would "proudly cosponsor the bill" and she has, along with 28 other representatives. From one representative to 28 is progress! To date 20 states have co-sponsored. However, the bill has been sitting in Judiciary and it is doubtful that this Congress will get it passed. USDA has an amendment ready for the 109th Congressional Session and we will keep you posted. Some things take forever!



I am also happy to report that



#### MT. OLYMPUS PUNCH

4 cups cranberry juice 2 cups orange juice

2 cups apple juice

2 cans (6 ounces each) pineapple juice

2 liters ginger ale

Chill the juices and ginger ale. Just before serving, combine juices in a punch bowl. Stir in the ginger ale.

Yield: 4-1/2 quarts.
