Dancing in All 50 States

We met on a blind date in 1951 that ended up at a barn dance. We never heard of square dancing again until a caller/teacher at a church social called a barn dance in 1993. Since we like fellowship, exercise, fun, and meeting new people, square dancing was a perfect bond joining these interests. We were approaching our 7th decade when our classes concluded in 1995, so we decided to make the most of this gift of time.

Dancing in all 50 states was not originally a goal, but as opportunities presented themselves, it grew out of our becoming increasingly absorbed in the activity. Our 50th state was Alaska in August of 2004. We have also danced in 4 provinces of Canada and Scotland. We be-



lieve we have traveled some 150,000 miles in the activity.

To date, we have visited 208 different clubs and 63 conventions, and danced to 832 different callers.

In New York State we danced in the Rochester, Finger Lakes, Capital District and Hudson Valley areas. We enjoyed dancing with eight Rochester Federation clubs, and at the Promenader Benefit Dance. The clubs included: Cayuga Cut-Ups (Aug. '01 Weekend at Wells College), with Phil Eno, Victor Swing-A-Longs (9/27/01) with Mike Herne, Tecumseh's class (9/28/01) with M.J. Ebenhack, Tecumseh Squares (3/1/02) with Bob Ellis, Copy Cats (3/2/02) with Dave Eno, Cloverleaf Squares (3/3/02) with Mike Callahan, Silver Squares (3/4/02) also with Mike Callahan, Batavia Silver Stars (3/4/02) with Bob Meagher, and Dalton Gang (3/5/02) with Will Herzog.

For our travel, we have used our car on trips up to

500-600 miles (one way), and fly and drive for greater distances. Daylight hours are valued for sightseeing on roads less traveled where "America lives," for interesting sites on the way, well researched beforehand. It is essential to consult the latest directory (or the Web) and call club contacts in planning a trip. We strived to find clubs or conventions dancing on successive nights in adjoining states so that an ideal day's travel would be within 250± miles.

> This was our favorite activity as we met so many other friendly dancers one-on-one, and being out of state all the more curious about us.

Managing the expenses of such trips would seem daunting; however the following possibilities are suggestions. For airfare, use frequent flyer miles when available & mid-week fares are the least expensive, as are weekly car rentals compared to day rates. Overnights were arranged with a 2000-member reciprocal bed and breakfast club known as Evergreen. Through this group since

1998, we have stayed in 66 host homes in 34 states. Our cost is a \$75 per year membership fee & \$15 per night per couple, such that we have had almost no need to stay in a motel for years. An interesting fact is that 15 percent of our host couples are or were square dancers. Our hosts have given us much insight into their local cultures and they were as important to the enjoyment of our trips as were any of the square dance people we met. On our part, we have hosted travelers from many states as well as from Canada & England.

Our hope is this article will encourage other "empty nesters" who have seen many retired friends move away or pass on to adopt square dancing as an activity that can fill the social void, and one which they can pursue almost anywhere.



1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

ner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance.

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.
