In Memoriam

The Promenader was very saddened to learn of the death on Jan. 24, 2005, of their long-time columnist, **JOHN ZIERLE**, who wrote the "Chef Z" recipe column from February 1993 until this Feb./March of 2004. We reported in the April/May 2004 issue that John and his wife, Kay, had moved to an assisted living facility, and had to leave behind his books and other culinary resource materials.

John and Kay first got interested in square dancing around 1986, after one of their sons had been involved in a reenactment of the Civil War. John enjoyed Americana, made needlepoint flags for a while, and loved traveling, collecting train whistles and square dance memorabilia, and especially meeting people.

A deacon of the Catholic Church for over 20 years, John was someone you could go to, and was always willing to help others.

John had a passion for cooking and the culinary arts, and celebrated life in eleaborate meal preparations and excellent dance treats. And he could handily come up with an expansive range of recipes on request.

Deacon John Zierle – our Chef Z – served his church and his community, as well as his square dance family.

The square dance community wishes to note the passing of **JOE DANNA** on Jan. 24, 2005, at the age of 93. Joe learned square dancing later in life – while in his 80s, and worked very hard to become a proficient dancer. He graduated from Cloverleafs Squares, and also danced with Silver Squares and Belles 'N' Beaus.

In addition to square dancing, Joe participated in ballroom dancing for many years at the Moose Club. His profession was carpentry, and he was a long-time member of the Carpenters' Union. He enjoyed participating in bocce, horseshoes, and bowling.

Joe Dana was always willing to help others in need, and served as an Angel for several Cloverleaf classes.

His enthusiasm for square dancing and positive attitude will be missed.



booklet, it is shown to the Federation presidents or their reps, who will verify the names and authorize the dancer to wear the special Silver Club badge dangle.







Cloverleaf D.A.R. Update

Here's some background for those not familiar with Dance-A-Rama (DAR). It is held annually on "Reunion 36 in 2006" Labor Day weekend, spon-36th Annual Single nce-A-Rai sored by Single Square Dancers USA (SSDUSA), and takes place in a different city each year. In 1988, over 800 dancers from all over the U.S. and Canada attended the 18th Annual DAR, hosted by Cloverleaf Squares at the newly opened Rochester Riverside Convention Center.

The club and city wishing to host this convention must bid on it two years in advance. After enjoying the 33rd DAR in Albuquerque, NM in 2003, we decided it was time to bring this event back to Rochester. We investigated potential sites and found that the RRCC is still the best place in Rochester to accommodate this large number of dancers. The Hyatt Hotel, connected to the convention center by a skyway, was selected as the host hotel, and we worked with the Greater Rochester Visitors' Association to prepare and present the bid at DAR in Atlanta in 2004.
