





Enhancin' Dancin'

Each year square and round dancing gets more and more dancers without partners. They may be single dancers, widowed or divorced, or married dancers whose partner is not able to dance. These dancers are usually welcome at their own dance club, but are often ignored at other clubs or special dances.

What can we as square dancers do to make them feel welcome? What can the rest of the square dance world do to help the single dancers? Can we afford to lose a single dancer? Can we afford the continual dropping of attendance? The best thing we can do is make sure they are welcome at your club dance.

If a single dancer comes to visit, make sure they get a chance to dance. The club members should always make sure all visitors are having a good time and they have a way to dance. Let the single dancer know which of the other dancers are there by themselves. Suggest to the couples in the club that they give up one tip a night so that their partners could dance with the dancers that don't have a partner.

When clubs have lessons for square dancing, they should welcome single people to join in on the lessons. Once the lessons are over, encourage them to join your club and make them feel welcome in all your club activities including your club dance.

One thing to remember is while you are dancing in a square, you are a single dancer because you dance with other partners at least once in a tip. This is in no way any different than asking a single dancer to dance. Think about it!

What can the single dancer do to ensure they have a good time wherever they dance? When you get to a dance, introduce yourself to the members of that club. When the music starts, stand by the dance floor looking like you are eager to dance. Don't sit around and wait for someone to find you and ask you to dance. Make sure the singles are welcome! Happy dancing!!!

East... and they were full. Thankfully, Sue and Gordon White let us into their square,


and we had the best square we ever had anyway.
