Harangue on Recruiting

September is just around the corner. Have you talked to anyone about learning to square dance? Will your club have a class this year?

We all know that new members are the life-blood of a club, yet many clubs can't seem to make the effort to recruit and train new dancers. New members bring vitality to your club, people with energy and new ideas. Now is the time to be lining them up for fall classes.

Don't rely on handouts, demos and other promotional items for recruiting. Don't expect that the efforts of the Promotion & Development Team will produce recruits. These things make it easier to recruit, but they don't close the deal! All our experience shows that personal contact is what gets new members. Surveys of new dancers tell us that even people who responded to advertising, consider that it was personal contact that brought them into the class.

Many of us do not have the grace that makes approaching an acquaintance comfortable. Think again! No one is insulted by an invitation to join. It's flattering. You are saying "I think you are interesting, fun, etc. and would like you to join my club." Consider sending a potential dancer a short note of invitation. It's a low pressure approach.

And try not to have preconceptions about responses. You just don't know how they will respond until you ask.

Lastly, if your club recruits a class, remember it's up to you, not the caller, to keep them coming. People join square dance clubs for the social activity as well as dancing. Embrace your class members; treat them as if they had already joined your club and they will keep coming back.

In Memoriam

The *Promenader* joins the Rochester area dance community in mourning the loss of Caller Mike Callahan's mother, Irene Callahan, who passed away on June 26, 2005.

Irene and her husband Ray were active area square dancers in the late 1950s and 1960s. They were charter members of Country Twirlers and the club's first treasurers in 1959. They danced with Country Twirlers and other area square dance clubs until 1967. They were then members of the Fiddle-a-Rounds Round Dance club (Charlie & Perky Tucker, leaders), and danced with that club until the early 1970s. Ray passed away in 1987.


Irene rejoined the square dance world in 1997 and took lessons at Cloverleaf Squares. She danced with Cloverleafs through 2003. She also was a member of Silver Squares and danced with that club until 2004.

Dancers: It sometimes happens that while dancing, a situation arises where someone collapses or faints, and it may be difficult for the caller to see what has occurred. IT IS IMPORTANT, therefore, that all dancers familiarize themselves with the square dance method of dealing with this kind of situation. This method is called E.C.M.A.

E.C.M.A. is the abbreviation for Emergency Call for

Medical Aid. This signal is designed for use by dancers to notify the caller of a medical problem in their square. When such a problem occurs, important minutes are often lost in the frenzy of waving arms and explanations which cannot be heard or understood across a crowded dance floor. The method of an ARCHED CIRCLE will assure the fastest possible response time by medical personnel to an emergency on the dance floor. In this way, precious, perhaps life-saving minutes, can be saved.

STEP ONE: When a dancer goes down, a second

dancer attends him/her.

STEP TWO: Remaining couples join hands and take a step backward. This allows the injured person and attendant air and room.

STEP THREE: Raise joined hands as high as possible in the form of an arched circle.

STEP FOUR: On seeing this signal, the caller or club representative will immediately place an Emergency Call for Medical Aid.

This system was, accord-

ing to historical sources, first introduced at the 33rd National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, in 1977. It was their hope that callers across the country would take the time to explain the arched circle ECMA signal to their dancers and familiarize them with both the procedure and its purpose. This is not being done and we feel that this is an important part of our being prepared in the event of an emergency.

Clubs — please familiarize your callers, members, and guests with this procedure.

...AND THE FROG GOES TO...



Victor Swings A Longs are looking forward to the new dance season. We will be making some changes, one of which will be going to a different dance night. We are in the process of arranging Friday






Save Saturday, October 8, for our second annual Autumn Caper dance with Jeff Priest and Mary Hinkle. Also look for our Monkey dance this fall.


