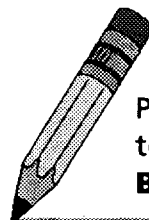

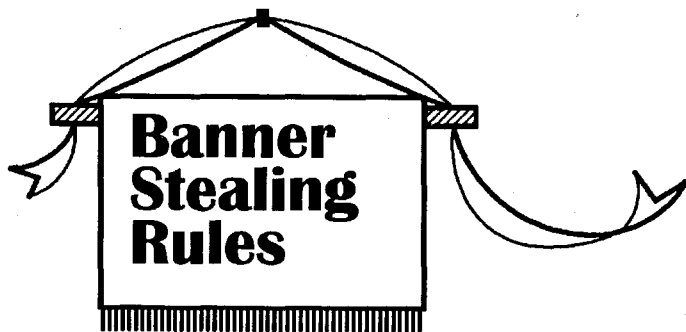

Clubs...

Please plan your schedule in time to get us your information on or **BEFORE the JULY 1 DEADLINE!**



1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.

2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner

the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

3) To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..

4) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.

5) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.

Our club has 112 dues-paid members and is constantly growing. Our club caller is Mike Callahan and our round dance leaders are Mark and Marlene Thone.

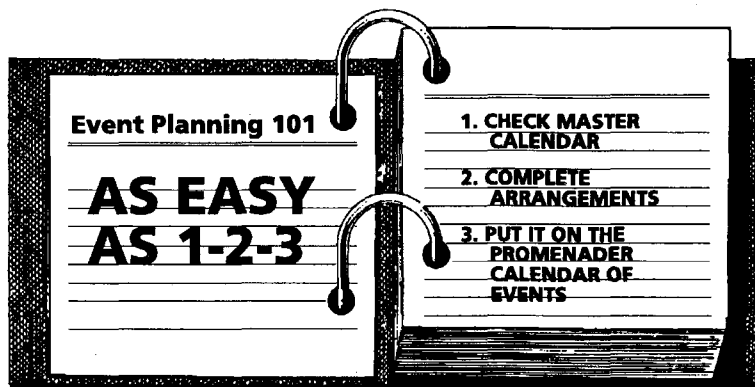
We dance most Sunday nights, year round with a few exceptions for holidays. On April 30, 2006, we gradu-

ated 21 new square dancers at Mainstream level, who are now honorary club members until next fall when our membership fees come due. They are currently learning their plus calls at our weekly workshops which are held every Sunday night May-August. In addition to our regular dances, we have at least one social event each month, giving our members an opportunity to see a different side of their friends and dance partners and learn more about

them on a personal level. We encourage visitors at any time and banner stealing is a favorite activity among our members.

We are hosting the 36th National Singles Dance-A-Rama over Labor Day Weekend at the Rochester Riverside Convention Center, where we expect 600-700 dancers from all over the US, Canada, and possibly other countries to join us for a fun-filled weekend of square and round dancing.

Have you ever been on a committee or board that was trying to decide on the date for a big dance? You probably want to plan your event on a date on which another club does not already have a big dance scheduled. Otherwise, you risk having less dancers available to attend yours.



Master Calendar, proceed to **MAKE YOUR ARRANGEMENTS**, and notify Ken immediately that it is all set.

3. SEND THE INFORMATION ON YOUR EVENT TO THE PROMENADER for publication in the next issue on our **Calendar of Events**. The charge is only \$5, and the listing stays in until it happens!

And the sooner everyone in our square dancing community knows about your event, the better your chances of success! So make it a point to list the event as soon as the arrangements are complete. Forms available by mail/e-mail.

The CIRCLE OF SERVICE AWARD is an award given to DANCERS ONLY who for three years or more have made a significant contribution to the Square & Round Dance Community.

Bill & Ann joined the Country Twirlers in September, 1970. They took lessons at the Genesee Dancers and were members there before joining the Country Twirlers. They were Club Secretaries in 1984 with Presidents Harry & Eleanor Easton. Back in those days, when the club had many members, a nominating committee would beat the bushes for new officers and often ended up taking office themselves.

In 1987 Ken and Kay advanced from vice presidents to presidents for the first time, and rather than try to get a

Ann makes great pies! They are always at Country Twirler dances early to help whenever there is any decorating to do.

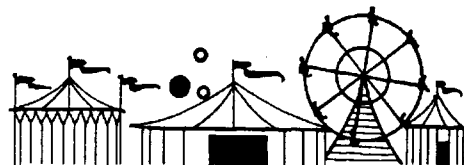
This year they volunteered to fill an opening on the D.O.R. committee as, YOU GUESSED IT — "Secretary."

This-n-That *from the Editor's Desk...*

Dance-O-Rama 2006 was similar to many previous ones, and yet different in a number of ways. This was our seventh year on the D.O.R. committee, so like the others, we had a lot of the preparation routine in hand. The D.O.R. event always impinges mightily on our *Promenader* production schedule, usually putting us a whole weekend behind because of the intensity of the preparation work the day before, the all-day running around the day of, and the complete exhaustion the day after. Plus, coverage of D.O.R. and the Daphne Norma Award presentation always comes about after our May 1 deadline. A lot of follow-up work is also delayed a week. We are only able to work on the *Promenader* on weekends because employment and coursework fill our weekdays. Normally, that is sufficient.

This year, however, Andy is now a full-time student at R.I.T., pursuing a degree in Medical Informatics, and a part-time lab assistant at the college, with Betty also taking coursework part-time while working nearly full-time. So this year, we had the added circumstance of multiple college course final projects and exams thrown in the mix. With the help of our advertisers, we should be able to cover production expenses until the end of the year, as we have done throughout the nearly eight years we have been editors.
