Please plan your schedule in time to get us your information on or **BEFORE** the **JULY 1 DEADLINE!**



- 1) Clubs taking part in Banner Stealing must register with the Rochester Area Federation and have at least one "Traveling Banner" to be stolen.
- 2) To steal a banner, the Stealing Club must have at least four couples who pay the visitors' fee. A representative must advise the Host Club's president at least 48 hours in advance. (If more than one club is going to steal a banner

the first club to notify the Host Club has preference.) It is the responsibility of the Stealing Club to safeguard the stolen banner and return it only to the owner's club.

- **3)** To retrieve your stolen banner, you must have at least four paying couples. To steal the Host's banner on the same dance night, you must have an additional four paying couples and notify the Host Club 48 hours in advance..
- **4**) If a banner has not been retrieved within a reasonable time (three months of the dancing season), the stealing club is allowed to send no more than four couples, as (non-paying) guests, to return the banner. The owning club shall be notified a week in advance of the plans.
- **5**) Banner stealing and retrieving shall be restricted to regular scheduled dances only. Special dances with a guest caller are subject to approval, in advance, by Host Club's president.

them on a personal level. We encourage visitors at any time and banner stealing is a favorite activity among our members.



Here is what you need to do:

1. As soon as you have an idea of when you might want to have the



event, and before you sign the contract with a national caller, or make any other commitments, **CALL THE MASTER CALENDAR** CHAIRMAN (Ken Georger, 585-247-7259).

2. If the date is available on the

Master Calendar, proceed to MAKE YOUR ARRANGE-MENTS, and notify Ken immediately that it is all set.

3. SEND THE INFORMA-TION ON YOUR EVENT TO THE **PROMENADER** for publication in the next issue on our Calendar of Events. The charge is only \$5, and the listing stays in until it happens!

And the sooner everyone in our square dancing community knows about your event, the better your chances of success! So make it a point to list the event as soon as the arrangements are complete. Forms available by mail/e-mail.

This-n-That from the Editor's Desk...

Dance-O-Rama 2006 was similar to many previous ones, and yet different in a number of ways. This was our seventh year on the D.O.R. committee, so like the others, we had a lot of the preparation routine in hand. The D.O.R. event always impinges mightily on our *Promenader* production schedule, usually putting us a whole weekend behind because of the intensity of the preparation work the day before, the all-day running around the day of, and the complete exhaustion the day after. Plus, coverage of D.O.R. and the Daphne Norma Award presentation always comes about after our May 1 deadline. A lot of follow-up work is also delayed a week. We are only able to work on the Promenader on weekends because employment and coursework fill our weekdays. Normally, that is sufficient.












Cathy Bock Honored
